of lands being the residue of my aforementioned plantation including  
all the buildings and lands bounded before my eyes  
to my John P. Montgomery I also give and bequeath to my said  
daughter the income and one horse colt two years old two cows  
and all herds there sheep and all my stocks of hogs I also give to  
my said daughter all my furniture utensils except my horses  
which I give my son John P. Montgomery I also bequeath  
my said daughter all my household furniture except so  
much as my wife Mary Montgomery claims which is to be at  
her die postal I also give my said daughter my horses and  
stockings I also give my said daughter one thousand dollars  
on which I have with my Son William and John G. the  
goods and property bequeathed to my said daughter Peggy P. Mont-  
gomery she is bound to pay all my just debts prior all buried  
expenses of my self and her mother and give her mother a com-  
fortable Disborth during her natural life also give and  
bequeath to my good Son David George William and  
General Montgomery one dollar each to be paid in property out of  
the property left to my daughter Peggy P. Montgomery I also  
give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter Susan  
Blithe Dead one dollar in property I appoint David Con-  
stable my Son John P. and Peggy P. Sherry among my execu-  
tors of this my last will and testament witness my hand  
and Seal 15 April 1827 Thomas Morris my Sub

the two horses and blacksmith tools and my part in  
the Languard to be valued these and Hester and her present  
are to be equally divided among my children Polly Kallert  
Elizabeth Rebekah and Patsy at the death of my  
wife Elizabeth my lands to be equally divided between  
my two boys Michael and Joseph the land divided as fol-  
lows beginning above the Oak Creek Spring fence running  
to the sheep fold from thence so as to divide it equally  
between them and his property to remain in the place

In the name of God amen I Joseph McFadden of Blount County and  
State of Tennessee being weak of body but of sound mind and memory  
thanks be given to God Almighty to mind the uncertainty of my body and  
knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die as Constituted make  
and ordain this my last will and testament as follows and first  
of all I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that  
gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting  
but I shall receive the same my soul at the General Resurrection  
by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate  
whatever it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life  
I do dispose of the same in the following manner and form  
My first gift to my daughter Polly comes one dollar & I give to  
my son David S. McFadden my plantation known by the name  
of the Log Bay and one saddle & I give to my daughter Nancy  
McFadden my Bureau & give to my daughter Lucy McFadden twelve  
dollars in trade to be paid out of my property I give to my son  
Andrew McFadden one rifle gun and if the same should be  
disposed of before he comes of age he is to be paid twelve doll-  
ars up to date out of my property and after all my just debts  
and funeral expenses be paid I give and bequeath to my wife  
Elizabeth McFadden the balance of all my estate both real  
and personal during her natural life and at her death  
I desire that the balance of the property what is left to be  
equally divided between my children namely David S. McFadden  
Nancy McFadden Lucy McFadden and Andrew McFadden  
and do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth  
McFadden and my son David S. McFadden my sole execu-  
tor and Executrix of this my last will and testament  
and I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every other  
will and testament by me hitherto made and do testify  
this and no other to be my last will and testament so  
witness whereof I the said Joseph McFadden have hereunto  
set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of October  
in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and  
ninety eight
