3rd It is my will that Andrew Doyle shall have one hundred dollars when collected out of what is owing me when collected.

4th It is my will that my father Philmer Green shall have the south half of the lot No. 10 in the town of Coleraine, also in lots of land that joins the said land and also that after the legacies left to each are paid to be paid out of what is owing to me that my father shall have one half of the remainder of what is owing by him, paying to my sister Angeline Montgomery her share of the amount out of it that he in his wisdom may apportion just and right.

5th It is my will that my mother shall have one hundred dollars of the money that is in my hand and my boy Perry that is my father's.

6th It is my will that my brother Anthony B. Green shall have an equal portion with my father of all the debts when collected, also all the money and property that is not specifically named herebefore to me or more individuals.

7th It is my will that my brother Anthony B. Green shall execute this my last will, in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal at Coleraine and discharging my father and former wills by me made, this 25th day of September 1843. Signed, sealed and acknowledged to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request have set our names as witnesses to the same.

In the name of God Amen, I Jacob McConnell of Blount County South most firmly being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 7 day of April in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say give I recommend my soul to God that gave it my body I recommend to be decently buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same and as for my worldly substance I wish it to be distributed in the following manner: In the first place I allow my lawful debts to be paid and unpaid charges of all my lands and movable property to be at the disposal of my dearly beloved wife Rachel for the use and support of my children during her natural life or widowhood and if she were to have the third of the estate and I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved children the rest of my estate to be equally divided among them at the discretion of my executors allowing my sons to get the land I now live on and pay the girls an equivalent and a bushy water and ordain my dearly beloved wife Rachel and my worthy friend Samuel Thompson, Executors of this my last will and testament and then to choose another to their assistance in witness whereof I the said Jacob McConnell have to this my last will and testament at my hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed published and declared by the said Jacob McConnell the testator as his last will and testament in the presence of us.
