In the name of God Amen Elijah Brown of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount 1st being in a low state of health but of a sound mind and judgment and calling to mind the frailties of man the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time when I shall make my last will and testament I do hereby give and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a Christian like manner at the expense of my heirs I do give and bequeath unto my aged mother a decent maintenance and decent burial at her death. I do give and bequeath my beloved brother David Brown one bond horse - I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Brown the remainder of my estate both real and personal to be completely paid out while she lives and be disposed of by her at her death, as she may think proper after all my just debts are paid. Except five shillings apiece to each of my brothers and sisters not heretofore received and I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Polly Brown and Joseph Henderson my sole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament 2^d Signed in the presence of us this 27th day of December 1814.

In the name of God Amen I John McCalloch of Blount County and State of Tennessee being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say, 1st I desire that all my perishable property be immediately sold after my decease and out of the moneys arising therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid - 2^d After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I give to my brother Thomas McCalloch two dollars. I give to my two nieces Nancy McCalloch and Elizabeth McCully the remainder of the moneys and also such debts as may be owing to me at my decease to be equally divided between them - I give and bequeath to my brother Samuel McCalloch the plantation I now live on and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends John Caldwell and John McCully my Executors of this my last will and testament. I hereby revoking other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 28th day of October in the year of our Lord 1814
