I William McTier of Blount County and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament and first I recommend my soul to God that give it And my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial My will is that all my just debts be fully paid And as to what worldly estate it pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner following 1st I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth McTier all my estate both real and personal during her natural life and widowhood and at her death or marriage 2nd I give and bequeath to my Son William B. McTier the farm whereon I now live to be and remain his and his heirs forever And if my executors think my estate will admit of it that my said son get a classical education 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah H. Chapman the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property valued by my executors and at their discretion 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna B. Johnson the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property valued by my executors 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly McTier all my household and kitchen furniture except one bed and furniture to be given to my Son William B. McTier 6th And at the death or marriage of my beloved wife the remainder of my property to be sold by my executors and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between my daughter Polly and my Son William 7th I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth McTier Alexander Humphreys and John B. McTier to be my executors of this my last will and testament to which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of July 1845

Executor I desire I give and bequeath to my wife Mary McTier all of the tract of land I now live on that lies east of the creek upon which my first wife is situated on with the Mill and Banks in the west side of the mill-dam also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McTier Dr. Adam Francis and others also one Negro Girl by the name of Polly also all of my perishable property except one Tray three eight & nine years old and my household and kitchen furniture together with all of my money and all debts which is owing & may become due me it is my will that she my wife Mary McTier shall have the sole Control and management of the same as her own right and property during her natural life and at her death I will the wife to her of disposing of the same as she sees proper do I hereby give and bequeath to my friends Moses Cooper and Miles Brooks that part of my tract of land where they now live that is to say all that lies on the west side of the mill creek also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McTier Dr. Adam Francis and others as described before it is my will that my two friends Moses Cooper and Miles Brooks have equal rights to the lands bequeathed and at liberty to dispose of the same as seems to suit them it is also my will that my friend Moses Cooper shall have my Rifle Gun I hereby give and bequeath to my niece Minerva McTier my Tray three eight & nine years old and also one fine dog Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Hugh Bogie and John Bogie my executors In witness whereof I do this my will set my hand and seal Charles McTier

Montgomery Thomas In the name of God Amen I Thomas Montgomery of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory sensible of the mortality of the body do make and ordain this my last will and testament I desire to resign my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried The property which I now possess or have bestowed me after my just debts are paid and expense of my funeral I dispose in the following manner first I give and bequeath to my Son John T. Montgomery one hundred and fifty two acres of land part of the plantation on which I now live the South and west side of said plantation beginning on the line of the land granted to Joseph Orr Dec. thence running between the buildings of said Son and a piece of cleared land between my said Son's house and my own and leaving my Orchard Barn and two fields of cleared land on the east and north of my cleared land are left out of the land which I bequeath to my said Son with this proviso that he is to allow my daughter Peggy Montgomery privilege of cutting timber for rails to make sufficient fencing the part of the plantation that I bequeath to my said daughter Peggy Montgomery also bequeath to my said Son

John P. Montgomery in yearling Colt a mare I gave and bequeath to my daughter Peggy P. Montgomery Seventy five acres of land being the residue of my aforesaid plantation including all the buildings and black land mentioned before and I give to my John P. Montgomery I also give and bequeath to my said daughter the two negroes and one horse both two years old two cows and one heifer three sheep and all my stocks of hogs I also give to my said daughter all my farming utensils except my horse which I give my son John P. Montgomery I also bequeath my said daughter all my household furniture except so much as my wife Mary Montgomery claims which is to be at her die so that I also give my said daughter my linen and trunks - I also give my said daughter one third part of the way on which I have with my sons William and John of the aforesaid property bequeathed to my said daughter Peggy P. Montgomery she is bound to pay all my just debts pay all unpaid of sums of my self and her mother and give her mother a comfortable subsistence during her natural life I also give and bequeath to my son David George William and General Montgomery one dollar each to be paid in property out of the property left to my daughter Peggy P. Montgomery I also give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter Susan Plishe Dead one dollar in property I appoint and constitute my son John P. and Peggy P. jointly and my executors of this my last will and testament witness my hand and seal 13th April 1827

McClure in name of God Amen I Richard McClure of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of earthly life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bestow on me with a good and conscience the same in manner following that is to say I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate 2^d I give and bequeath to my loving wife one negro girl named Hester during her natural life or widowhood 3^d I give unto my children David John and Hannah five shillings each to be paid out of my estate 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy an equal portion with the rest of my daughters to be paid out of my estate as aforesaid with my executors the two horses and blacksmith tools and my part due the landyard to be valued three and Hester and her portion are to be equally divided among my children Polly Kallert Elizabeth Rebecca and Patsy at the death of my wife Elizabeth my hands to be equally divided between my two boys Michael and Joseph the land divided as follows beginning above the fair yard spring fence running to the deep from thence so as to divide it equal man then thence across the property to remain on the place

for the use of it the place be it understood that John Kim Kuper possesses when he now lives for the space of nine years provided he keep up the fence on the halves and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Joseph McRay and Elizabeth McClure my wife Executors of this my last will and testament hereby working all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made in witness whereof I have here set my hand and seal this fifth April 1827

In the name of God Amen I Joseph McFadden of Blount County, And State of Tennessee being weak of body but of sound mind and memory thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of my body and knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die as constitute make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows and first of all recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that give it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the General Resurrection by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I do dispose of the same in the following manner and first I do give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Ann one dollar I give to my son David S. McFadden my plantation known by the name of the Long levy and one saddle I give to my daughter Nancy McFadden one barrel of gun to my daughter Mary McFadden twelve dollars in trade to be paid out of my property I give to my son Andrew McFadden one rifle and if the same should be disposed of before he comes of age he is to be paid twelve dollars in trade out of my property and after all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid I give and bequeath to my wife Elender McFadden the balance of all my estate both real and personal during her natural life and at her death I desire that the balance of the property what is left to be equally divided between my children namely David S. McFadden Nancy McFadden Mary McFadden and Andrew McFadden and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elender McFadden and my son David S. McFadden my sole executors and Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every other will and testament by me heretofore made and do confirm this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Joseph McFadden have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.
