My will is that all my just debts be fully paid and as to what worldly estate it pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner following 1st I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elisabeth McGee all my estate both real and personal during her natural life and widowhood and at her death or marriage 2nd I give and bequeath to my son William C. McGee the farm wherein I now live to be and remain his and his heirs forever and if my executors think my estate will admit of it that my said son get a classical education 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah H. Chapman the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property Valued by my executors and at their discretion when

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna B. Johnson the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property Valued by my executors - 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly McGee all my household and Kitchen furniture except one bed and furniture to be given to my son William C. McGee

6th And at the death or marriage of my beloved wife the remainder of my property to be sold by my executors and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between my daughter Polly and my son William C. I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elisabeth McGee Alexander Humphreys and John B. McGee to be my executors of this my last will and testament to which I have hereunto subscribed my name this fourth day of July 1825 - Wm. McGee Seal

Executive Privously of give and bequeath to my wife Abby McGee all of the tract of land I now live on that lies east of the creek upon which my Estate were situated on with the Mill and Banks in the west side of the said creek also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McGee Sr. Adam Davis and others also one Negro girl by the name of Dolly - also all of my perishable property Except one tiny mare eight or nine years old and one Bridle horse all of my household and Kitchen furniture together with all of my money and all debts which is owing to me may become due me it is my will that She my wife Abby McGee shall have the sole Care take and management of the same as her own right and property during her natural life and at her death will the same to her of disposing of the same as she sees fit to do I highly give and bequeath to my friends Moses Cooper and Milas Cooper that part of my tract of land where they now live that is to say all that lies on the west side of the mill creek also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McGee Sr. Adam Davis and others as described before it is my will that my two friends Moses Cooper and Milas Cooper have equal rights to the lands bequeathed and at liberty to dispose of the same as seems to Suit them it is also my will that my friend Moses Cooper shall have my Rifle Gun Firstly I give and bequeath to my wife Abby McGee my ring my more eight or nine years old and also one Ring daily wear Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Martin H. Brooks and Abram Boyle my executors In witness whereof I do it this my will Set my hand and Seal - Wm. McGee

Montgomery On the name of God Amen I Thomas McGee citizen of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being weak of body but of sound mind and desiring memory sensible of the Mortality of the body do make and ordain this my last will and Testament of desire to resign my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried. The property which God has given me has bestowed me after my just debts are paid and expense of my funeral to dispose in the following manner first I give and bequeath to my son John C. McGee my one hundred and fifty two acres of land part of the plantation on which I now live the South and west side of said plantation beginning on the line of the land granted to Joseph Orr Dec. then running between the buildings of said son and a piece of cleared land between my said sons house and my own said leaving my orchard Barn and two fields of cleared land on the east and north of my cleared land are left out of the land which I bequeath to my said son with this proviso that he is to allow my daughter Peggy Montgomery property of nothing hinder her to make sufficient fenceing the part of the plantation that bequeath to my said daughter Peggy Montgomery also bequeath to my said son

her die postal I also give my said daughter my horses and
stockings I also give my said daughter one third part of a
way on which I have with my Son William and John G. the
gores and property bequeathed to my said daughter Peggy P. Mont-
gomery she is bound to pay all my just debts from all buried
in favor of my self and her mother and give her mother a com-
fortable Disborth during her natural life also give and
bequeath to my good Son David George William and
General Montgomery one dollar each to be paid in property out of
the property left to my daughter Peggy P. Montgomery I also
give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter Susan
Blithe Dead one dollar in property I appoint David Con-
stable my Son John P. and Peggy P. Sherry among my execu-
tors of this my last will and testament witness my hand

dollars in trade to be paid out of my property of mine to my son
Andrew McFadden one Puffe and if the same should be
disposed of before he comes of age he is to be paid twelve doll-
ars up to date out of my property and after all my just debts
and funeral expenses be paid I give and bequeath to my wife
Elizabeth McFadden the balance of all my estate both real
and personal during her natural life and at her death
I desire that the balance of the property what is left to be
equally divided between my children namely David McFadden
Nancy McFadden Lucy McFadden and Andrew McFadden
and do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth
McFadden and my son David McFadden my sole execu-
tor and Executrix of this my last will and testament
and I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every other
will and testament by me hitherto made and do testify
this and no other to be my last will and testament so
witness whereof I the said Joseph McFadden have hereunto
set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of October
in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
ninety eight
