 James 8th I bequeath to my Son David one dollar at the death
 of my wife Catharine 9th I bequeath to my Son Robert one
 dollar at the death of my wife Catharine
 10th I bequeath to my Son Abolom one dollar at the death
 of my wife Catharine - I hereby revoke and make none
 and void all former wills by me made - I hereby appoint
 William Farmer and Joseph Colpau my Executors at will - In
 testimony thereof have here unto set my hand and Seal
 this the 31st day of July, A.D. 1836. This the thirtyninth day
