I John Megue of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount do
hersby make my last will and testament in the manner and form
following that is — On the first place after all my just debts paid
give to my wife Agnes Megue the sole care of this farm and posses-
sion of the house as usual during the minority of my Sons William
and John Megue my morn and also to be at her direction during her
life a saddle horse and a new saddle to be
purchased out of my estate also one hundred dollars in Cash but
in case she should require it is my will that she should have two cows
and Calves with a third part of the household and money off the farm
the sum of Two hundred Dollars to be disposed of as afterwards directed but when I
say my wife shall have the direction of my affairs I mean that she
has all my tools for the use of the farm in clauding the Smith
Tools and Stock of every kind except such as is here otherwise dis-
posed of — 2nd I give to my son James Megue the tract of land
he now lives on to him and his heirs forever also a tract of land
lying in the other Side of the court House by Bowlers place to
him and his heirs forever. 3rd I give my daughter Amy one hundred
and dollars in a horse and Cattle. 4th I give to my Sons
William Megue and John Megue the farm I now live on and
all the farm known as the Edwards property farm to be
divided equally between them William the younger and John the
older and which I give to them and their heirs forever but should
William die before he dies to settle on the open farm I allow him

one third of the whole Stock not otherwise disposed of and a third part of farm
lying thereby between an equal share of the Smith tools by his executors and myself.
Share of the expense in dividing the tools. The other two thirds to be my wife
Agnes Megue and John Megue for the use of the lower farm with John as

if not John is to build himself a house and have one third of the farming
house and Stock. then William and him to contribute an equal Share for a

case my executors Barbours should survive after the decease
of wife Agnes Megue it is not my will she should go out of the family
or should she have any income that her and them should be equally
divided between Will John and Polly Megue — And lastly I hereby
constitute and appoint my friends John Hamal and Peter I regard
executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other
former wills or testaments by me heretofore made In witness whereof

Margaret W. Cheeney being weak in body but of sound mind hereby
in all probability in my last bed of sickness have made this my last
will and testament follows that is I appoint James Berry my Exec-
utor and first of my and bequeath to my Sisters Patsey Cheeney
of Cheeney and Biley Cheeney the sum of Sixty dollars each
to be paid him by my executor within three years after my decease
my said executor being allowed to retain the said Sixty Dollars until that
sum expires without being accountable for interest — I leave for the use of
my Sister Polly Etale Sixty Dollars allowing my executor to pay the
same to her in such way and at such times as he may think her necessi-
ties require or in case of her death to divide the same among her daugh-
ters at his own discretion I also leave to my daughter Etale one
feather bed and Clothing provided she should move to this Country
I leave to the Southern and Western Theological Seminary located at
Maryville the sum of forty Dollars one fourth of which to be paid
annually after my decease until the debt is paid and lastly after
the debts heretofore are paid and my funeral expenses are discharged
I leave the balance of my Estate of every description entirely to my
Sister Rebecca Etale in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 22nd Day of March 1824
