I Margaret Wear of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and nullifying void all other wills at any time made by me I first direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may be possessed of or may find come into the hands of my Executors Secondly I give and bequeath to my son James P. Wear all of my Stock of cattle Thirdly I give and bequeath to my three daughters Elisabeth Martha and Louisa P. Wear all the money I may have on hand equally at my death after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses also whatever sum left of money or notes of hand in John Black of Augusta County Virginia and John Black of Same County and State Notes bearing date 8 13 day of Sept 1832 also whatever interest may have as che of the legacies named in Joseph Shipp will who died in Augusta County Virginia in the year 1825, or bequests to be divided between my three daughters above named. Fourthly I will and bequeath that all my household and kitchen furniture together with all other property I may possess not heretofore bequeathed be equally between my three daughters Elisabeth Martha and Louisa P. Wear nor interfering with what the girls have of their own Fifthly I will and bequeath to James P. Wear a sufficient sum of money out of a Reserve claim that I expect to get if it is gotten to pay his debts up to the present date and the balance if there remains be used be equally divided between my three daughters Elisabeth Martha and Louisa P. Wear Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint John P. Wear and Robert Eagleton my Executors in witness whereof I do this my will setting hand and seal this 2nd day of July 1849 Margaret Wear (seal)
