And she is to obtain a title for the land from the office her-
self or likewise bequeath to my wife Deborah the bed and furni-
ture she now occupies and one bed and one chest and likewise one
from the part of the cupboard and dresser furniture. Secondly
I bequeath to my son Elias H. Malcolm my saw mill tract of
land situate on Crooked Creek and one cow named Till and
her calf I bequeath to my son Alexander Malcolm the
remaining two thirds of the plantation on which I live and
he is to enter the land in the office and is to pay my son
George two hundred dollars in good trade if the land be
sold before it be taken out of the office and if the land
cannot be nor is not sold previous to its entry in the
office nor Alexander will not pay the above two hundred
dollars in good trade to my son George then George is to have
and fully possess the third and Alexander the other third
I likewise bequeath to my son Alexander a brown hupen
sown by the name of Bart's Kipper and likewise a small
walnut table. Fourthly I bequeath to my eldest daughter
Elizabeth one bed and furniture and a cow known by
the name of Burns and her calf and likewise one fourth
part of the dresser and cupboard yards. Fifthly I bequeath
to my daughter Sally one bed furniture and one cow
and calf and one fourth part of the dresser and cup-
board furniture. Sixthly I bequeath to my daughter Elly
one bed and furniture one cow and calf and likewise one fourth
part of the dresser and cupboard furniture. Seventhly I bequeath to my son Joseph five
dollars to be discharged in a horse when the tract of land
that I have on Barber's Creek is sold. Eighthly I bequeath
to my son Walter ten dollars in trade to be paid
when my Baker's Creek tract of land is sold.
Ninthly I bequeath to my son James ten dollars to be dis-
charged in good trade when my Baker's Creek tract of land
is sold. Tenthly I bequeath to my son William that part
of his tract of land on which he now resides running the
course of the creek to Kilpatrick and from the bridge
on the creek to the foot of the mountain where said
piece or division of land is to be divided by this end
of this tract on which I now dwell be divided as above de-
scribed. Eleventhly I bequeath to my son George a little brown
horse called Jaws. Twelfthly I bequeath to my son John
ten dollars in trade to be paid when the Baker's Creek tract
of land is sold and Elly is to be maintained by this end
of the plantation until she become of age or otherwise her way
of living I likewise ordain and appoint Andrew Kennedy Ch-
arles Kilpatrick and my son John Malcolm to be the Exe-
cutors of this my last will and testament in testimony of
which I have subscribed my hand and seal this Twelfth
day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and seven 1807.

I John Woodward of Albion County and State of Tennessee being
sick and weak in body but of sound mind and age posing
memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertain-
ty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such
worldly substance substance as is hath pleased God to give
me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following that
is to say - First I desire that all my personal property be imme-
diately sold after my decease except so much as may be necessary
+ regard as the doing of my widow - and out of the moneys arising
therefrom all my debts and funeral expenses be paid and the
remainder of said moneys if any be appropriated to pay moneys
of installments upon my land and if my decease should
take place between the first day of May and the first day of
January that we think of the crop and one third of the part
if fastened be sold - 2nd of give and bequeath to my beloved
wife with the plantation on which I now live during her natu-
ral life or widowhood I also give and bequeath to her
my bed and bedding cupboard and furniture all the house-
hold and kitchen furniture which she brought with her
upon our marriage & that she has made since and all my
farming utensils also all the cattle and moneys that she
brought with her also all my sheep and half of my hogs
I also give and bequeath her a black horse called Jolly, a
cow mare called Darcus and a sorrel filly between two and
three years old - 3rd of give and bequeath to my son
John Woodward five dollars - 4th of give and bequeath
to daughter Mary Gates five dollars - 5th of give and
bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Russell ten dollars
6th of give and bequeath to my son George Woodward twenty
dollars and Mistle's notes in the new Testament
7th of give and bequeath to my son Nicholas Woodward twenty
dollars and my wearing clothes 8th of give and bequeath to
Charles Woodward five dollars and my large Bible
9th of give and bequeath to my daughter Reematha Perry
twenty dollars - 10th of give and bequeath to my son Car-
lie Woodward five dollars - 11th of give and bequeath
to my daughter Providence Mitchell fifty dollars
12th of give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Mitchell
fifty dollars - 13th of give and bequeath to Thomas W. W.
Woodward forty five dollars and Woods Dictionary of the Bible
14th of will that the above legacies be paid out of the sale
of my land and the remainder be equally divided among
my children Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
friends William Mallen junr and John Cox Executors of this
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I

of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty six

I to all whom these presents may come know ye that I Thomas
Robert of Blount County Tennessee being weak of body but of
a disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality
of my body do make ordain and constitute this my last will
and testament in form and manner following viz.

1st It is my will that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
by my Executors out of my personal estate - 2^d - I give and
bequeath unto each of my three daughters namely Sally Catharine
and Louisa a feather bed and furniture a cow and woman
saddle to be worth together five dollars to each of them

3^d I give and bequeath to my son John Robert the Brown Blazed
paid mare a yoke of Oxen and a Rifle Gun he now claims also
a Good many Dollars - 4th It is my will that the install-
ments due the State for my land be paid by my executors out of
my personal estate and that the residue and remainder of my
personal estate if any then be be equally divided between my
son John Robert and my three daughters namely Catharine Sally
and Louisa - 5th I give and bequeath unto my son William
Robert and to my daughters Polly Handworth and Betsey Clark and
Peggy Glass one dollar each to be paid out of my personal estate

6th I give and bequeath the rents and profits of my plantation
known I now live in Blount County Tennessee to be applied by
my executors to the use of supporting and schooling my children
that may be in minority at my decease to be equally divided
between them according to age until the more at full age

7th It is my will that on my youngest child arriving at full
age then be laid off by a due east and north line across
my said plantation Eighty acres off the north end of said tract
of land giving Polly Cartwright's land which Eighty Acres
I give and bequeath unto my son John Robert to him his heirs
and assigns forever - 8th 2^d It is my will that on the arrival
of my youngest child at full age that the residue and
remainder of my plantation known I now live be sold by my
Executors after named at public vendue to the highest bidder and
the money arising therefrom be equally divided between my son John
Robert and my three daughters namely Catharine Sally and
Louisa and that my executors execute all that to the purchaser

9th I do hereby declare constitute and appoint John Henry Jones
and John Coulson Executors to this my last will and testament
and do hereby disannul all former wills or wills by me made
and ordain this and this only to be my last will and testa-
ment - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 20th day of the twelfth month in the year one
thousand eight hundred and twenty four - Thomas Robert

I Robert Alexander of the above State and County being very sick
and believing that death is fast approaching though of a sound
mind and of a disposing memory and being desirous to settle all
my worldly matters do constitute make and appoint this my last
will and testament in the words following - It is my will that
after my death my body shall be buried in a decent Christian
like manner - 1st - It is my will that all my just debts
be paid - 2^d - It is my will that my beloved wife Mary shall have
a decent comfortable living in the farm I now live on during
her natural life time and at her death the right of said land
to descend entirely to my son Roman and also at my wife's
death that my son Roman shall have one half and a rea-
sonable portion of furniture for said land - 3^d - It is my
will that my son Roman shall take into view the helpless
and difficult situation of my daughter Mary white and
that as soon as practicable by will out of my perishable
property help her to twenty or thirty dollars in trade as he
may think best - the trade to be at trade rates
4th - It is my will that at the death of my wife all the
perishable part of my estate that then remains shall be equally
divided among all my children - and that my son Roman
execute this my last will - In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Seal this 24th day of September in the
year of our Lord 1834.
