her calf I myself bequeath to my Son Alexander Malcolm the
residue two thirds of the plantation on which I live and
he is to enter the land in the office and is to pay my son
George the hundred dollars in Trade trade in the land he
Sold before it be taken out of the office land if the land
cannot be paid in full before its entry in the
office nor Alexander will not pay the above two hundred
dollars in Trade to my Son George thus George is to have
and fully possess the third and likewise the other third
I likewise bequeath to my son Alexander a brown humper
Known by the name of Hart's Humper and likewise a small
Walnut Table Fourthly I bequeath to my eldest daughter
Elizabeth one bed and furniture and a cow known by
the name of Anna and her calf and likewise one fourth
part of the dresser and Cupboard same. Fifthly I bequeath
to my daughter Sally one bed and furniture and one half
Cow and Calf and one fourth part of the dresser and Cup-
board furniture. Sixthly I bequeath to my daughter Elly
one bed and furniture one cow and a calf known as
likewise one fourth part of the dresser and cupboard furni-
ture. Seventhly I bequeath to my Son Joseph fifteen
dollars to be discharged in a horse when the tract of land
that I have on Barkers Creek is Sold. Eighthly I bequeath
to my Son Walter ten dollars in Trade to be paid
when my Bakers Creek tract of land is Sold.
Ninthly I bequeath to my Son George ten dollars to be dis-
charged in good Trade when my Bakers Creek tract of land
is Sold. Tenthly I bequeath to my Son William that part
of this tract of land on which he now resides running the
course of the creek to Kilpatrick and from the Bridge
on the Creek to the foot of the Mountain which said
part or division of land is to be laid off before the end
of their tract on which I now dwelle be divided as above de-
scribed. Eleventhly I bequeath to my Son George a little Brown
horse called Jesus. Twelfthly I bequeath to my Son of Ten
dollars in Trade to be paid when the Bakers Creek tract
of land is Sold and Elly is to be maintained by this end
of the plantation until she become of age or otherwise may
desire I likewise ordain and appoint Andrew Kennedy Ch-
ester Kilpatrick and my Son John Malcolm to be the Ex-
ecutors of this my last will and testament in testimony of
which I have Subscribed my hand and Seal this ¹¹ day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight

of installments upon my land and if my decease should
take place between the first day of May and the first day of
January that we think of the crops and the value of the part
of fallow be sold - 2nd of give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Ruth the plantation on which she now live during her natural
life or widowhood of also give and bequeath to her
my bed and bedding Cupboard and furniture all the house-
hold and kitchen furniture which she brought with her
upon our marriage & that she has made since and all my
farming utensils also, all the cattle and increase that she
brought with her, also all my sheep and half of my hogs
I also give and bequeath her a black horse called Jolley, a
cow mare called Darcus and a small filly between us and
three years old - 3rd of give and bequeath to my son
John Norwood five dollars - 4th of give and bequeath
to daughter Mary Gates five dollars - 5th of give and
bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Rudd ten dollars
6th of give and bequeath to my son George Norwood thirty
dollars and Misty's note in the new Testament
7th of give and bequeath to my Son Nicholas Norwood twenty
dollars and my wearing clothes 8th of give and bequeath to
Charles Norwood five dollars and my large Bible
9th of give and bequeath to my daughter Keziah Perry
twenty dollars - 10th of give and bequeath to my son Gar-

To all whom these presents may come Know ye that I Thomas Stoblet of Blount County Tennessee being made of body but of an spending mind and memory and failing to mind the mortality of my body do make and give and constitute this my last will and testament in form and manner following.

It is my will that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executors out of my personal estate - &c. to give and bequeath unto each of my three daughters namely Sally Catherine and Louisa a feather bed and furniture a cow and mowm Saddle to worth Eighty five dollars to each of them \$30.00 and bequeath to my son John Stoblet the Brown Blazer paid once a yoke of Oxen and a Rifle Gun he now claims also a good swang Saddle - &c. It is my will that the installments due the State for my land be paid by my executors out of my personal estate and that the residue and remainder of my personal estate if any there be be equally divided between my Son John Stoblet and my three daughters namely Catherine Sally and Louisa - &c. One and bequeath unto my son William Stoblet and to my daughters Polly Hardwick and Betty Glass and Peggy Glass one dollar each to be paid out of my personal estate &c. I give and bequeath the rents and profits of my plantation whereon I now live in Blount County Tennessee to be applied by my executors to the use of supporting and educating my children that may be in minority at my decease to be equally divided among them according to age until the arrival at majority

It is my will that on my youngest Child arriving at lawful age there be Land left by a due west and north line across my said plantation Eighty acres off the north end of said tract of land giving Polly Cartwright Land a tract Eighty acres \$100 and bequeath unto my son John Stoblet to have his heirs and assigns forever - &c. It is my will that my second and my youngest Child at lawful age that the residue and remainder of my plantation whereon I now live be sold by my executors after named at public vendue to the highest bidder and the money arising thereon be equally divided between my Son John Stoblet and my three daughters namely Catherine Sally and Louisa and that my executors execute or let to the purchaser

It is my just intent Constitute and Apoint John Story bone and John Carlson Executors to this my last will and testament and to make all former wills or wills by me made and ordain this and this only to be my last will and testament - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 20th day of the twelfth month in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty four - Thomas Stoblet

State of Tennessee Blount County - In the name of God Amen I John Alexander of the above State and County being very sick and believing that death is fast approaching though of a sound mind and of a disposing memory And being desirous to settle all my worldly matters do constitute make and effect this my last will and testament in the words following - It is my wish that after my death my body shall be buried in a decent Christian like manner - After it is my will that all my just debts be paid - At 3rd It is my will that my beloved wife Mary shall have a decent comfortable living on the farm of now live on during her natural life time - And at her death the right of said land to descend intirely to my Son Norman and also at my wifes death that my Son Norman shall have one bed and a reasonable portion of Furniture for said bed - At 3rd It is my will that my Son Norman shall take into view the helpless and difficult situation of my daughter Catherine and that as soon as practicable he will out of my finishable property help her to twenty or thirty dollars in Trade as he may think best the trade to be at trade rates

At 4th It is my will that at the death of my wife all the perishable part of my estate that then remains shall be equally divided amongst all my children - And that my Son Norman execute this my last will and witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 24th day of September in the year of our Lord 1834.

Queene To all whose it may concern be it known that I am in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory declining and to stably die as my last will and testament with respect to such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bestow; to wit first after my decease my wish is that my body be buried in a decent Christian manner and my soul I recommend to God who gave it; and my funeral expenses and just debts to be paid as well as my executors hereafter named can make it convenient - And secondly to my living wife Inquiry for his aged and infirmities the fifth part of my tract of land wherein I now live to be laid off abutting to the execution of my executors so as to include the buildings and Spring level with as little prejudice as conveniently may be to the other four fifths of said tract of land and the owner or purchaser of this tract of land shall have full power to sell or otherwise dispose of said tract of land under the authority of this will to have full access to said Spring doing as little damage as may be to the part hereby devised to my said wife also you and bequeath to my said wife right and title that I have or might have in and to two slaves with a Negro man called Ben and a Negro woman
