 of the family; also that my said wife be sold for the use of the
 family to be an amanuensis and bequeath to my Grand
 Son David Cairns to wit David Cairns a son of my son
 James Cairns my May man Baddeley and wife, but if he
 cannot get them or they cannot be conveniently sent to him
 before the time of the Sale of the other property herein Authorized
 to be sold then said May man Baddeley and wife to be sold
 by my executors and the proceeds of said Sale to be vested
 in my said said wife and also her equal share with
 her Brothers and Sisters as herein after provided, it is my
 will and desire that all my other estate real and personal
 not herein specially devised be sold as regarding to the execution
 of my executors and the proceeds thereof dividing as fol-
 lows to wit I will and bequeath to my Son Robert Cairns and
 William and to my daughter Sally Donahoe the sum of five
 dollars each, I will and bequeath to the Children of my said
 daughter Sally Donahoe by her husband Henry Donahoe
 the sum of three hundred dollars to be divided equally
 amongst them - I will and bequeath to my Grand Childman
 John a son Cairns Sally Cairns Peggy Cairns David Cairns
 William Cairns Robert Cairns William Cairns Henry Cairns
 and Mary Cairns the third of my son James Cairns all the
 residue of the proceeds of the Sale of my estate not herein
 specially devised to be equally divided amongst them
 except one fifth of the proceeds thereof of the Sale of the Slaves
 and other personal property which I will and bequeath to my
 said wife saying I further will and bequeath to my said
 wife all my household and kitchen furniture except the
 cupboard and table - Further it is my will and desire that
 my slave Matt be free at the age of fifty five years, and that
 my slaves Silvia, Maria, Eliza, Ann, Mary, Charlotte, Polly,
 Eliza and Gilbert respectivly free at the age of forty
 five years and also that the Children of the female part of
 the said Slaves be respectivly free at the age of forty five
 years, and that this be a condition in the Sale of said
 Slaves, Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
 wife James and my friend James Wilson Executors of this
 my last will and testament, hereby revoking and disannul-
 ling all former wills that might or may have by me been
 made - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and Seal this twenty first day of October in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven
 A.D. the word "her heirs and assigns" Daniel Cairns did
 in the 3rd line the word "instruments" in the 11th line the words of David four fifths of the 9 line in
 the first page, the word "daughters" 4th line, the words "of the
 proceeds of the Sale of the Slaves and other personal property"

being in health and sound in mind but feeling to mind the
mortality of my body do make this my last will and testament
First I commend my soul to God who give it and my body to
be laid in the Grave my whole estate to be distributed as follows
I allow all my just debts to be paid according to law, I allow my
wife Letitia to have a reasonable maintenance of Board and most
out of the benefits of my land during her living my widow
also all the kitchen furniture and Bedding and the benefit of
her Choice of the Cows, and a horse with a side when necessary
my share of the bequest to my daughter Sarah one dollar
also to her son John McConnon one dollar, also to her daughter
Letitia and Susan each a half a Cape or yearling, I leave
to my daughter Jane Catherine to her son William one dollar
and her son John a horse or Hair Coat also to her daughter
Liza Jane and Nancy each a half share to my son John
a small share the oldest I would I leave to my daughter
Margaret Fifteen the dollars in money I leave to my son
Samuel a lot of thirty Eight dollars of a note signed by
him to me for a year and then I have to my daughter Eliza
one Cow, I have to my son Alexander one part of the land
he has with my part of the same with him I leave to my
son Robert all the land with the improvements on the South
Side of the Creek belonging to the place I live on, I leave to my
son Thomas all the land on the North side of the Creek
with its improvements, I also leave this the black man and
Sard Pilly with the one half of the arable the other half to
Robert the arable one as follows to wit, all the Cows young and
old except those above mentioned and all the sheep and hogs and
the negro and all farming utensils to be equally divided between
Dr Robert and Thomas the land not to be sold until their
mother dies or marries and she is to have her choice whom
to live with Alexander or Robert, Thomas, But the two she
deest live with to be equal parts suppling her I leave to Ro-
bert the Percy Drive my son John to have my broad Mouth
Chest this the big Bible and Chest at his mother's death and
Robert the Chest of Drawers I allow my son Thomas to have
the full possession use and benefit of the mansioned property
and land But not to be at liberty to dispose of it till hers
of age I leave and bequeath to daughter Henry one dollar
