Henderson taking care of her until her father and mother get her in possession of home that she lives with one of them then until her father can come and get her again I desire that her father comes Houston with her for her again I desire that my Executors make some suitable arrangements for her refugeance to send her with her father

11th I will and desire that my friends Robert Porter Rufus W. Bradston and Joseph Henderson shall execute this my last will and testament surely revoking and annulling every other former wills and testaments by me at any time heretofore made. Ninthly I give and bequeath all the balance of of my Estate of every description to my wife Esther Plumlee and it is my will that at the death of my said wife Esther Plumlee that my two Slaves Milton and Henry be set free agreeable to the laws of the state of Tennessee lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Hagers Ruder my Executor in witness whereof I do to this

Second I do give unto my daughter Elizabeth a large eight gallon Pot and I do give unto my daughter Janet a cornell my bed and furniture with my floor wool and reel also my Arm chair together with all new and small Pot. — 4th I do give unto Mary my Butler and all of my Pot books together with my five dogs, shawl and Dressed.
