I August Thompson of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount and town of Maryville do hereby make my last will and testament in the manner and form following 1st I desire that so soon as the same may be convenient or practicable after my decease all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid and further I desire that any perishable property or a part thereof may be exposed to sale should it be necessary - 2^d after the payment of my Just debts and funeral expenses I give to my wife Elizabeth Thompson the one half of my plantation the other half to my son Jesse Thompson, the plantation to be divided according to quantity and quality. The half that falls to my wife Elizabeth to be disposed of at her death as she may think fit so as to go to the benefit of my children. It is also my desire that my son Jesse Thompson take the management of said farm and land it or cause it to be tilled, so as to raise grain sufficient for the support of my family and his own 3^d I give unto my wife Elizabeth Thompson all my town property the household furniture and kitchen

furniture to be hers until her death and then to go to her
 daughters to wit, Eliza Blakburn, Esther Chapman, Elizabeth
 Thompson and Jane Thompson and Driscoll Montgomery and Hugh

 and Burrows and Jane Thompson and Augustina Thompson to
 get each of them a dining table and Chhany Press, as the old
 set got when they married and I allow my son Jesse Thompson
 to furnish them with the dining tables and Chhany
 Presses above mentioned, and for him furnishing them
 I give him all my stage tools and the planks for to make
 him a wheel. 4th I give over my son Fictum Thompson my library
 of books and book Case and unto my daughter Driscoll
 B. Montgomery I give a horse to be with security for de-
 ars which horse he to be furnished to her by my son Jesse
 Thompson in the fall of 1829, or in the Spring of 1830, as she
 may desire - 5th I give to my wife Elizabeth Thompson a
 note that I hold in James Blott for one hundred twenty sum
 dollars and fifty Cents for her support and the support
 of the children that may live single with her, also a
 note in Jesse Thompson for twenty sum dollars and fifty
 Cents to go to the payment of debts in the State also
 twelve dollars that Samuel McCollah owe me to go to pay
 the State debts, also a note in Cladiah Bray for Eight
 dollars to go to the same use if necessary. 6th I give what I hold in my son Jesse Thompson for
 him furnishing my daughter Driscoll B. Montgomery
 the horse mentioned before this I allow him to have the
 balance of the sum - 7th I appoint my wife Elizabeth
 Thompson and Jesse Thompson as my executors to my
 estate in full power to act in all things according to
 Law, Do signed, sealed and published and declared
 to be my last will and testament of the above named
 Andrew Thompson in presence of us also at his request
 and in his presence have hereunto subscribed our
 names as witnesses to the same, This 18th day of June 1828
