But also after my debts are paid, and the installments on the land are paid, I allow her one fourth part of the money of the money that is now due the Estate and at day fully 5th bequeath to my son John Houston one half of the land and one fourth part of all the money due the Estate after my debts are paid, and the installments on the land are paid - 3rd of give to my son Samuel Houston one half of my land I now live on and one fourth part of the money now due the Estate after my debts are paid and the installments on the land are paid. Also my wife Mary and a note on Samuel Rogers and George Davis for one hundred and forty dollars he buying his brother from ten dollars out of the last mentioned note. 4th I bequeath to my son Joseph one third part of the value of the land I now live on as he paid by John and Samuel. Equally for the land being left to him and one fourth of the money due after my debts and the installments paid on the land. 5th I give to my son in law John Maby one hundred and forty dollars one hundred out of the money that he owes me for the land and he owes on and forty dollars to be paid him by William Wright in consequence of a note of William Wright. 6th I give to my son in law William Wright one hundred out of the money he owes me for the land he lives on. 7th I allow the remainder of my property to be valued or sold at the discretion of my Executors and to be equally divided between Polly, Dolly, Daisy, Fanny and Betsy. Lastly I do appoint my son John Houston my brother James Houston and my nephew James Henry the Executors of this my last will and testament. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son James Thompson a certain tract of land decreed to me by William & David Carson, as twenty acres off of the tract of land decreed to me by Hugh Williamson to be laid off joining the Carson tract on the south side of the Montgomery Road the line to run straight from said road to Patrick McFishing line, parallel with the line of said Carson tract so as to contain the said twenty acres.

In the name of God Amen I Josiah Martin of the County and Territory of said being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this 22nd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say first I give and bequeath to my loving wife, Elmer Martin all the household furniture and my Bowls more and two Cows forever and twenty acres of Bear land in my Nine Mile place where I now live and what Bear land is already to go to her use and the remainder of the twenty acres to be cleared and paid for out of the stock and likewise the fence to be kept in good repair out of the same I also allow her a good comfortable house to be built by John Cowan for her to live in on any part of the said tract of land. She thinks proper to appoint I also allow her one third part of my stock or my hogs yearly for her support - I also allow my son James Martin to hold that part of my Nine Mile plantation which lies west of the Spring Branch during her natural life and at his death to fall into the hands of his children, and to be theirs and their heirs forever - And I do give and bequeath to my son Joseph Martin and my son in Law John Cowan the other part of my Nine Mile plantation lying east of the Spring Branch to be equally divided between them in quantity and quality to them their heirs and assigns forever except so much of my son Joseph's part as shall be a comfortable maintenance to his son Josiah Martin - If he continues in a single condition I also leave in his hands of John Cowan sixty six dollars and two thirds for the use of supporting my wife Elmer Martin with fire wood and such other necessaries
