In the third place I will and bequeath to my son and son Abraham Dix my fine over coat in the fourth place I give and bequeath to Thomas Davis my son in law my will gown in the fifth place I give and bequeath a horse Tipton all the rest or notes that I hold in trust and at my death with my nothing can in the sixth place I give and bequeath to Elijah Davis and James Davis and to John Davis my Grand sons and to Elizabethe Davis my Grand daughter and to James Walker to have as much more as either of the Grand children and the above named Grand Children each one to have equal shares in the seventh place my will is that all the notes that I hold in Trust Walker shall be sold to the highest bidder whom the rest of my property is sold to Martha Tipton do appoint Walter Walker Executor of my estate.

In witness whereof I have signed this my last will and testament hereby writing and putting my hand full other wills by me at any other time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executors but after to be removed. Second I give and bequeath unto my wife Jane all of the property she brought home with her namely two beds bedsteads and clothing one banister and small Table, two spinning wheels, an old and new Kitter, also one half of the Kitchen furniture such as pots, pans, Crocks, Jars, five dogs and various. one Kitchen Table with other articles such as bed bows, Copper Pots and other articles used in the Kitchen also an equal divide of all articles used in the dairy, Chambers Crocks and other vessels also one half of the cupboard furniture. bridge and blanket (first choice) One gun and saddle
harness I will and bequeath unto my wife Jane her and
children to be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of my
estate unto her by my executors which amount and the
articles enumerated in the second stage before mentioned are
considered by me to be her full share and portion of all
my estate and that she is to have no claim to any
or any other claim in my estate whatever either real or
personal. Fourthly I give unto my Son David Thompson
from my slaves place. Fifthly I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Anna Henderson my negro girl named
Rebekah with her marriage if any or otherwise disposed
of the proceeds. Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Grand
son Lewis L. Thompson son of my daughter Rachel
Dunn an deceased ten thousand and one fifty dollars in
cash to be paid unto him out of my estate. And as
I have paid unto my Grand Daughter Martha Mc
Bradford formerly Martha A. Thompson ten hundred and
thirty dollars which amounts I consider as their full
share of my estate and they are to have no further
claim in my estate whatever. Seventh my desire
is that the remainder of my estate of every description
both real and personal fall into the hands of
my executors who are hereby impowered and
directed to sell the same first to sell to sell all
perishable property of every kind and description
as soon as they are qualified and give such notice
as can be had at public sale to the highest bidder
at such time as they may think to the best interest
of said estate. Eighth to sell my two slaves Charles
and Alice upon such terms as may seem to the interest
of said estate and my desire is that they be sold to
masters that will not remove them out of the reach
of their wives. Ninthly to sell all of my lands with
the improvements thereon to the highest bidder on such
terms as may seem to the interest of said estate.
Tenthly my desire is that my executors after paying
all of the debts and bequests before mentioned and
paying all lawful charges and expenses of any expense
in attending to the full execution of said will
divide the remainder equally between my five
children to wit David Thompson my Aunt Elizabeth
Eliza aforesaid Thompson Robert A. Thompson and
Mary A. Brundt after first deducting the amounts
hereafter charged to each one to wit David Thompson
ten thousand Dollars to Ann Henderson three
hundred dollars to Eliza aforesaid Thompson retaining to
Robert A. Thompson twenty dollars and to Mary
Ann Brundt ten hundred and thirty five dollars
which amounts charged to each one has been paid in
money and other property to each of them by me
and it is my desire that each of my children named
above should receive the same amount equal to
