Tulloch one hundred acres of land less or more forming lands with William Mellicum and Abraham Melick with the possession thence - 4th I also give and bequeath to my son Samuel my red Kiger 5th I also bequeath unto my son Samuel one feather bed and bedstead and furniture - 6th I give and bequeath unto my son James an spotted Kiger and all my traps and sheep one feather bed and furniture and bedstead and all the residue of my household and kitchen furniture 7th I bequeath unto my two sons Samuel and James my Gray & Fawn and all my farming tools to be equally divided between them two 8th I bequeath unto my daughter Mary Sharp five dollars 9th I bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Vargas five dollars 10th I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Moore my white face cow my Maliney Chest 20 five dollars in money 11th I bequeath unto Andrew the Tulloch and Hannah Eliza Tulloch Daughters of my son John Tulloch best each of them two dollars 12th I bequeath Millicum L. Tulloch son of my son John Tulloch best my saddle and bridle and two dollars in money - 13th I bequeath unto Magnus L. Tulloch son of my son John Tulloch best two dollars in money 14th I bequeath unto my two Grand sons of my son John Tulloch best my wearing clothes
