This fifty dollars she may apply to the benefit of such youths as she may think proper of poor families and further she is to have possession use and all the profits of all my landed property during her natural life and at her decease all above all my landed property to be divided to the legitimate heirs of my four brothers viz William Daniel and David Thomas Woods and equal part to each family and I further hereby release and exonerate David M. Candless from all debts and demands that I may have against him with conditions
