to contract. Article 4. I give and bequeath to my son  
Samuel Wilson one hundred and fifty dollars to be paid to  
him by executors aforesaid at the time the money is allowed  
for the sale of my personal property as aforesaid. I desire  
to conclude with respect to those of my children who have  
left me and gone for themselves thus my son John Wilson  
my daughter Mary and my daughter Betsy my son Robert  
my son James my daughter Rosalia my son Joseph and  
my daughter Anna have each received of my estate such  
portion as I allow them except my son Davis Wilson who  
I yet allow to have the sum of one dollar at any time  
when he applies for the same, in witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day  
and date first above written.

State of Penns<sup>s</sup> living sick and in a full & state of  
health fat & infirm and taking into consideration his  
uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and  
desiring to make and publish this as my last  
will and testament in the words following to my wife  
wife and desire that my beloved wife Aglaonella  
to have my two negroes Celsica and Bobo which her father  
father gave to her Father  
and wife and her at or after our marriage. I also give  
and bequeath to my wife one half in value of all my  
personal estate and one third absolutely of my real estate  
privately I will and bequeath the other half of my person-  
al estate and the other two thirds of my real estate to  
my brother and sisters and their heirs to wit Henry B.  
McKee, Alexander M. Wallace, Margaret Robinson, Jessie  
C. Wallace and William C. Wallace to be equally divided  
among them. Thirdly it is my will and desire that what  
debt I may owe of whatever description shall be  
chargeable upon and paid out of my personal estate  
privately. It is my will and desire that any interest in  
the remainder of the estate of William C. Wallace &c. shall  
be closed and carried up or continued as the case  
may be as my executors hereafter to be named shall  
in his judgment and discretion determine for the inter-  
est of the heirs. Fifthly it is further my will and  
desire that my executors shall have full power and  
authority to sell all or any portion of my real estate  
and execute little thereon, shant in addition to it to be

for the interest of the legatees to lease or to rent or lease & sell real  
estate or any portion thereof for such time of years and upon  
such conditions in terms as he in his discretion may think  
best and for the interest of the parties interested & stand to  
manage, control and do all things touching the premises accord-  
ing to the best of his judgment. As my last will and  
Appoint my beloved father William Wallace my executors of  
this my last will and testament with full and ample power  
to execute the same according to its true intent and meaning  
signd and sealed in the presence of This day of March  
1875.

By William Wallace the father of Samuel W. Wallace the testator  
and executor named in the above will as hereby certifed  
and state that I wrote the above and before mature  
will in my memory to and at the request of the deceased in  
as minute and particular manner and as according to his views  
and desires in every particular as I could do, and the  
same would have been executed by him, but he suddenly  
became badly deranged and remained in a drowsy state  
of mind until his death. May 1<sup>st</sup> 1875

Wheeler his portion of my Estate Third I have bequests  
before given unto my daughter Mary Thompson her  
portion of my Estate and bequeath unto  
my daughter Margaret Proctor the north and lower  
esterly part of my farm including my dwelling  
house and barn beginning at the house at John  
Lorington line thence thence down the branch in a  
line across the rear side the till house & back house a  
few feet distance unto the present property fence to the  
hole of vineyards line and likewise all of my sensible  
property except one log house and furniture hereafter  
disposed of. Fifth I have bequests before given unto  
my daughter Lura S. Soper her portion of my estate  
Sixth I have bequests before given unto my son  
Lawson Wheeler his portion of my estate Seventh  
I will and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza wife of  
the South end of my land running with the line  
that describes Margaret Proctor's portion of land
