as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and
bequeath the same in manner following that is to
say, first I desire that all my just debts and funer-
al expenses be paid - 2nd after the payment of my
debts and funeral expenses I give to my wife Eliza-
beth McCurdy all my personal property for and
during the term of her natural life and at her
death to be disposed of as she may see proper
3rd I give to my daughter Polly one dollar
4th I give to my daughter Peggy one dollar
5th I give to my daughter Eliza one dollar
6th I give to my wife Elizabeth McCurdy all my lands
of being the plantation I now live on with all its appurte-
nances to be enjoyed by her during the term of her natural life
but I should my son Henry McCurdy but should my
son Henry McCurdy come home and take care of
his mother and keep his family together, true and fair
then provides my will and desire is that he shall
at and after the decease of his mother have the land
above described to be enjoyed by him and his
heirs forever provided he the said Henry McCurdy
payeth to each daughter ~~Peggy, Eliza, and~~
Peggy a sume least worth eighty dollars each should
said Henry McCurdy return home from said
lands and means to receive my wife Eliza debts
to be disposed of at her decease has she may see
proper, and lastly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my friends Elizabeth McCurdy and Samuel
Houston Hunt, of this my last will and Testament
honestly writing all other former wills or testaments
by me hitherto made in witness of these survivors
set my hand and seal this 10th day of February
in the year of our Lord 1818.

his mother during so long as she lives and if he should
fail complying with the above obligation his mother is
to have full control of all the above named property
as long as she lives also to give the above named William
one half of my household and kitchen furniture to be
divided by valuation 4th I give and bequeath that
my two sons Silas and Nicholas have an equal and even
share of land & a equal division hundred acres to be run out
and dividing the first named hundred acre lot, and
Silas hundred acres to be run out adjoining Nicholas
lot, the two last named lots to be run out parted
within the first lot, alone North and South also
I wish my above named son William to have the
remainder of my land, also I wish my son Silas
to have the rods that was his hundred acres to be
run and the balance of all my property to be
sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between
the balance of my children Earth, I do hereby
renounce and appoint my son William my Executrix
in witness whereof I do the this my day set my hand
and seal, this 10th of December 1813.

dollars paid out of any money I may die possessed of
& give and bequeath all my interest in my father
Charles C. Warren's Estate to my sister Roberta Warren
to give and bequeath a my brother Paul Warren my Silver
Plate & I give to my brother Billy J. Warren my saddle
& bridle and bequeath to my sister Sarah L. Warren
elder daughter of T. B. L. Warren my horse Snow
11th of after each one named in this will shall get his
specified Legacy herein named and have three hundred
be a surplus left of my estate, it is my wish that my brother
T. B. L. Warren get what will make him up five
hundred dollars including the legacies already named
of any thing then remain of my estate it is my wish
that it be equally divided between my brothers Burton
S. Warren, Robert S. Warren and Mrs. H. Warren and
lastly, & so hereby nominate and appoint James C. Levy
and Nitrota McLean my executors to this my last will and

and the interest thereon accrued - 6th my daughter
Seabell has hitherto been duly provided for
7th to my daughter Anna I of give and bequeath a cow
year old calf, also a bed and bedding & bedding
as heretofore by her claimed 8th to my son Robert
Leedie a note of hand and bequeath to certain parts of land be-
longing on the line between William Wallace and my
self where my living branch crosses said line and
running with the said branch of said branch up
to my property from thence directly up a hollow to
Goodland's line thence with the line of Goodland
and myself to its intersection with Wallace's line
