Thomas Wear of Albion County and State of Tennessee being much in body but of perfect mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament and first I commend my soul to God, that give it and my body to the earth to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner following and first that my just debts and funeral expenses be fully paid - 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my <sup>daughter</sup> Mary Cans on the spot of land which I bought from Salome Adams including my son John the house now stands to be here and her heirs forever 3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly <sup>Martha</sup> the tract of land which I bought from John Wilson including the field which James Joseph Logan and William McLaugh as the same now stands to be here and her heirs forever 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Maria and my daughter Anna the balance of my estate both real and personal jointly during my wife's lifetime and at her decease the said balance to my wife and to my daughter Polly and Anna to be equally divided between my daughters Polly and Anna to be and remain theirs and their heirs of their body legitimate forever and my wife share of the personal estate to belong to my children - 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby nominate and appoint Samuel Wentzgermy John Eakin and James Longfance Executors to this my last will and to take much receiving all other wills heretofore made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January in the presence of eight witnesses and legally made.

Being in a low state of health but possessing sound judgment and good memory I deem it proper to make a final disposition of my worldly estate which is as follows 1<sup>st</sup> I bequeath to my wife Polly two hundred dollars out of my estate for her support during her lifetime also the bed and bedding with as much of the household and kitchen furniture as she may choose to remove to be for her own use and disposal forthwith - 2<sup>d</sup> after my just debts are all paid I allow an equal division of all my estate both real and personal amongst my children nevertheless as my son Jonathan Wear hold a note in one of them hundred and fifty dollars in three parts which has been due a number of years and as I have given him many at giving timber as I believe to the amount of said note I direct that I will not be deducted out of his share of my estate I bequeath Polly and Betsey child and my daughter Mary Betsey five dollars each as being all I intend to draw out of my estate 3<sup>d</sup> I direct that against the first day of March next that my servant John be set free without charge and wife Mary present witness - 4<sup>th</sup> I do hereby appoint Matthew Harman my son Jonathan Wear and John McLaugh Executors to execute this my will, made signed and sealed this 1<sup>st</sup> day of Sept 1832.

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Wear of the County of Albion and State of Tennessee being of sound mind memory and understanding but considering the uncertainty of this life think fit to make this my last will and Testament in the following manner 1<sup>st</sup> I recommend my soul into the hands of God and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First I will and bequeath to my well beloved wife Margaret the said house and five Cows for the use of the house and family and also the liberty and privilege of her own house her life time - I give and bequeath a my son Samuel the same I now live on with the negro and Cows and all other farming utensils with the bay horse to be his for the furnishing his mother and sisters a sufficient and comfortable support in such town as they shall think fit to remove - I my son David I bequeath the tract of land lying on the North side his land as one of the family till such time as is of the first day of January next I Samuel is to pay him fifty pounds in a new Crutcher and the balance
