Know ye that I Samuel Winter of the County of Polk and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament, 1st my will is that all my just debts be paid by my Executor hereafter to be named, out of the proceeds arising from my personal estate, 2^d I will and bequeath unto my wife Mary the use of the plantation I live on including so much of my personal property as will be sufficient for her support during her natural life or widowhood, 3^d I will and bequeath unto my sons David John Joseph and Andrew five dollars to each of them due to the sum of my daughter Hannah five dollars, 4th I will and bequeath unto my daughter Polly and Bayman I suppose to be worth fifty dollars, 5th I will and bequeath unto my daughters Nancy Sally Ann and Minnie each one halfy best worth fifty dollars and each a saddle worth fifty dollars and each a binder also each a cow worth ten dollars also each a bed and furniture worth twenty dollars also other household furniture worth twenty five dollars to each of them, 6th I will and bequeath unto my son Samuel twenty five acres of land off the east end of the tract of land I now live on, 7th I will and bequeath unto my son Sterling a tract of land adjoining the tract I now live on containing one hundred and nine acres, 8th I will and bequeath unto my other two sons Joseph and Stephen the balance of the tract I live on to be equally divided between them by their living my wife Charity her support as before mentioned, 9th I will and bequeath unto my son Samuel Sterling Joseph and Stephen the balance of my estate to be equally divided among them except one bay man which I will and bequeath to my wife Charity, 10th I constitute and appoint my friend, Barton Matthews and my son Samuel Executors of this my last will and testament making all others heretofore by me made void testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and official my seal this second day of March Eighteen hundred and thirty three Samuel Winter Test
