 live to complete their education each one to be furnished
 with a good horse saddle and bridle and a decent suit
 of clothing by said Zebulon B. and William L. Wallace
 Sixth. I bequeath a note of hand to William L. Wallace sum-
 ming four hundred and twenty five dollars on the lands
 for which it was given to Benjamin Jesse and Isaac A.
 Wallace to be equally divided between them as they may agree
 Seventh it is my will that the five hundred dollars note on
 John L. Farnold shall be equally divided between the other
 heirs at the decease of their mother. Lastly I do appoint
 John Zebulon B. Wallace, Executors of this my last will
 and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my seal this first day of January
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and

I Joseph Wear Son of Blount County Tennessee being in
 a feeble state of health but of sound mind and knowing that I
 must shortly leave this world have thought proper to make and ap-
 point this my last will and testament and I do hereby make
 all other wills by me heretofore made in the first place I wish
 my body decently buried. I then wish my property disposed of
 in the following manner to wit I allow all my just debts to be
 punctually paid I then allow my wife her support off the plant-
 ation during her life. I also allow her three hundred of land to
 live on and her two boys my household furniture of here to
 her disposal to my son John. I have already given the portion I
 allow him. I do wish my negro girl Bet to my son James, to
 my son Joseph I have already given that plantation I allow
 him in addition to the land &c. which he has given to my
 son Hugh. I allow him one cow and no more to my son
 Samuel leave the plantation on which I now live, with all
 the farming utensils and my negro and horse also two cows
 and all my tools and my negro boy Samuel Jack. I allow
 to my daughter Peggy one cow, to my daughter Molly
 I allow one bed and furniture, one bureau six head of
 cattle and I desire my large man to be appraised and
 the value of her to go to Molly, to my daughter Betsey I
 give my negro Boy Bob, and the man she took with
 her to Kentucky also one bed and furniture my dear
 is that the two above named negro boys Jack and Bob

be free at the age of thirty years but to grow up the above named
 persons until they arrive at that age. I allow to my Grand son
 Joseph son of John twenty dollars to be applied to the pur-
 chase of any land the balance of my estate I leave to my son
 Samuel. I do hereby appoint and request my brother Jonathan
 Wear and John Montgomery as my executors to execute this
 my last will and testament of the above I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my seal this 11th day of

I David Williams of Blount County of State of
 Tennessee being sick and weak of body the sound of whom
 and mind and understanding this my last will and testament
 in the following manner - First it is my will and desire
 that all my estate be given to my beloved wife Politha
 Williams to be at her disposal during her natural life
 or widowhood. Further it is my desire that if my wife
 should die or be taken from my children by death before
 they arrive to mature age that my executors apply my said
 Estate as a much of it as will be necessary to their support
 and education of my children while in minority and after
 they all come to mature age that my Estate be equally
 divided between my children namely Martha David
 Charity Nathan Godek Benjamin Sasaiah. Rachel
 Solomon Gabriel and Lastly I ordain and constitute
 my son Spanish Williams and James Warrum to be
 my whole and sole Executor of this my last will

 will and testament as followeth (1st) I give of all I do
 own and possess my soul to God that gave it and my body
 to the ground from which it came to be buried in
 a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my
 Executors - 2nd I bequeath to my eldest son Richard
 Williams after all my lawful debts is paid Shillings
 3rd I bequeath to my son John ten Shillings - 4th I bequeath
 to daughter Rebecca ten Shillings - 5th I bequeath to my
 daughter Sarah ten Shillings - 6th I bequeath to my
 daughter Susan ten Shillings - 7th I bequeath to
 my son James the plantation I now live on as it stands
 stocked and sowed with all my farming utensils Shoptools

Being in a low state of health, but possessing sound judgment and good memory I deem it proper to make a final disposition of my worldly estate which is as follows:

1st I bequeath to my wife Polly two hundred dollars out of my estate for her support during her lifetime also the bed and bedding with as much of the household and kitchen furniture as she may choose to reserve to be for her own use and disposal forthwith - 2^d after my just debts are all paid I allow an equal division of all my estate with real and personal except my children nevertheless as my son Jonathan Ward hold bond in one of them hundred and fifty dollars in three parts which has been due a number of years and as I have given him many at giving timber as I believe to the amount of \$400 note I direct that I will not be deducted out of his share of my estate. I bequeath Polly and Betsey child of my daughter Mary Betsey five dollars each as being all I intend for them out of my estate.

3^d I direct that against the first of March next that my servant John be set free without charge and wife Mary present witness. - 4th I do hereby appoint Matthew Hancock my son Jonathan Ward and John Hancock executors to execute the my will, made signed and sealed this 4th day of Sept 1832.

In the name of God, Amen, I Samuel Ward of the County of Albion and State of Tennessee being of sound mind memory and understanding but considering the uncertainty of this life, think fit to make this my last will and testament in the following manner: 1st I recommend my soul into the hands of God and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First I will and bequeath to my well beloved wife Margaret the drug house and five Acres for the use of the house and family and also the liberty and privilege of her own house her life time - I give and bequeath a my son Samuel the same I now live on with the negro and Geese and all other farming utensils with the bay horse to be his for the furnishing his mother and sisters a sufficient and comfortable support in such town as they shall think fit to occupy - I my son David I bequeath the tract of land lying on the North side his land as one of the family till such time as is of the age of twenty one then I am to be paid him fifty pounds in a sure estate and the balance

and household furniture and my son James is to pay all my debts one year after my death. 15th I appoint my son in law William Buchanan my daughter Margaret to keep & support and decently maintain my daughter Mary Williams during her lifetime and to give her a decent burial at her death. 16th I bequeath to my friends daughter Betty ^{daughter} and Mary Beale each one of them a second rate cow. 17th I appoint and institute my true and trusty friends John Gamble and Richard Williams to be the whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 4th day of June 1832 in the presence of John Williams and eight witnesses present. Andrew Beebe David Spruill Joseph Beale Junr.

Thomas Ward of Albion County and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory do make this my last will and testament and first I commend my soul to God, that give it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner following: And first that my just debts and funeral expenses be fully paid - 2^d I give and bequeath to my daughter the tract of land which I bought from Salome Adams including my own place where the house now stands to be hers and her heirs forever. 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Buchanan the tract of land which I bought from John Wilson including the field which James Joseph Logan and William McCamp as the same now stands to be hers and her heirs forever. 4th I give to my daughter Maria and my daughter Anna the balance of my estate both real and personal jointly during my wife's lifetime and at her decease the land given to my wife and to my daughter Polly and Anna to be equally divided. I leave my daughters Polly and Anna to be and remain thins and their heirs of their body legitimate forever and my wife share of the personal estate to belong to my children - 5th I hereby nominate and appoint Samuel Wentzgermy John Eakin and James Longfance Executors to this my last will and to take much receiving all other wills heretofore made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty three.
