I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly since the tract of land which I bought from John Wilson including the field which joins Joseph Lagan and William R. King as the fence now stands to be hers and no man during my wife Elizabeth Wines lifetime also my house Rose and a room and a half and the shop to be hers and her heirs forever. 4. I give to my son in law and my daughter Anna the balance of my estate both real and personal property during my wife lifetime and at her decease the land given to my wife and to my daughter Polly and Anna to be equally divided between my daughters Polly and Anna to be used remain theirs and their heirs of this body together from and my wife's share of the personal estate belonging to my children - 5 I hereby nominate and appoint Samuel Montgomery, John Eaton and James Douglass Executrix to this my last will and testament revoking all other wills herefore made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this first day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine. Being in a low state of health, but possessing sound judgement and good memory, I deem it proper to write a final disposition of my worldly estate which is as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> I bequeath to my wife Polly two hundred dollars out of my estate for her support during her lifetime also the bed and bedding with as much of the household and kitchen furniture as she may choose to reserve to be for her own use and disposal which after my just debts are all paid or allow an equal division of all my estate with real and personal property amongst my children nevertheless as my son Jonathan Wear holds a note in one of three hundred and fifty dollars or thereabouts which has been due a number of years and as I have given him many a living trust as I believe to the amount of said note or thereof that said note be deducted out of his dividend of my estate. I bequeath Polly and Peter my oldest son of my daughter Anna Bell five dollars cash as living assets initial for them out of my estate.

2<sup>d</sup> I direct that beginning the first of March next that my servant John be set free unless I change my will before I die Illinois. 3<sup>rd</sup> I do hereby appoint Matthew Cawie my son Jonathan Wear and John McDaniel executors to execute this my will made signed and sealed this 4<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1839.

I Samuel Wear of the County of Belmont and State of Pennsylvania being of sound mind, memory and understanding but Considering the uncertainty of this life, desire fit to make this my last will and testament in the following manner (viz) I recommend my soul into the hands of God and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner. And as touching my worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First my wife and bequeath to my well beloved wife Margaret the sum of one and five Pounds for the use of the house and family and also the little, and middling of her own house her life time - I give and bequeath to my son Samuel the farm I now live on with the wayes and Gears and all other farming utensils with the bay horse to be his for the supporting his mother and sisters as sufficient and comfortable support his son during the term as they shall think fit to occupy - To my son David I bequeath the tract of land lying in the 10th with his house as one of the family till such time as of the first age of twenty one then Samuel is to pay him fifteen pounds in a horse, carriage and the ballon
