The fifty dollars she may apply to the benefit of such youths as she may think proper of poor families and pastor She is hereby possessing use and all the profits of all my landed property during her natural life and at her decease shall allow all my landed property to be equal to the legitimate heirs of my four brothers by William, Amury and David Woods and equal part to each family and at farther liberty release and exonerate David Woods from all debts and demands that I may have against him with undated

that he parts in my goods together with the goods of my Deceased wife until death by abiding my beloved wife Eliza and Bob Wallace Wallace my Executors and Executrix of this my last will and testament be witness whereof I have written, set my hand and seal this 28th day of July 1837.
