Fourth:- It is also my will that if either of my children named in the second clause of this will shall desire to take his interest in the house and lot, other other than to hold jointly with the others, that such desire shall be made known to the others whereupon they shall select some discreet person to make an appraisement of the value of the same, when the others holding the said property shall pay the pro rata share to such withdrawing share or interest, less the costs of appraisement and making deeds and registry of the same, such withdrawing party conveying the interest to the others. In selecting such appraiser a majority of the shares shall rule.

Fifth:- I hereby constitute and appoint my son, William M. Wilson, as the Executor of this my last will and testament, and he is hereby relieved from giving bond with security as such Executor.
