Ann E. Mullendorfs Will.

I, give and bequeath to my two daughters D. Annie C. Mullendorfs and Mat Ella Mullendorfs my farm lying in the 12th Civil District of Blount County Tennessee to be theirs as long as they remain single at their death or marriage my will is that it shall be equally divided between my two sons William W. and Reuel L. Mullendorfs.

2nd It is my will and desire that as long as my two daughters remain single that all my unmarried children shall enjoy the proceeds and profits of said farm in common.

3rd It is my will and desire that, if on due consideration by all parties mentioned in the above provisions and by my executors, it is thought best, to sell the farm and reinvest the money in real estate somewhere else. This has been my intention for some time past believing that it would be to the best interest of my family to sell and reinvest the money in another locality.

4th I give and bequeath to the Baptist Church one half acre of land on which to build a house of worship, said lot is located as follows - Beginning on the corner of J. L. McCamys lot on which his residence stands and running with his line and with the public road one hundred feet and then up the hill far enough to include one half acre in the boundary.

If this lot is not utilized for this purpose in ten years my desire is that it shall be sold and the money appropriated to the Home and Foreign Missions of the Baptist Church.

5th I will and desire that my undivided interest in some mountain land owned by my father, J. M. Trumble died and inherited by me from his estate be sold and the money derived from the same be equally divided among my four daughters and my two sons, viz Mary B. Payton, Mattie C. French, Ida M. McCamys, D. Annie C. Mullendorfs, Mat Ella Mullendorfs, William W. and Reuel L. Mullendorfs.

6th I hereby appoint my husband E. L. Mullendorfs executor of this my last will and testament and I will and desire that he shall see that its provisions and details are carried out.

I give and bequeath to my sister Polly Sullard a horse here as long as she lives if she survives me also to have my meat, jellie and preserves potatoes. I want Rev. W. Ross at Sisters Pollys death to sell my land or rent it till he thinks he can sell it to the best advantage and the money for the land I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Lula Ross. The said Rev. W. Ross to be paid out of same for his trouble my \$200 check I give and bequeath to the said Lula Ross after buying expenses is paid and doctor bill and my cow to be sold to Temple Garner for \$15. if she wants her my hogs, chickens, sorghum, turkeys and corn, skum and all my buckets, tracts and jars I want sold and the money for the same I give to Lula Ross. but the table safe and meat chest are not to be sold till after Pollys death the money to go to Lula Ross.

I give and bequeath to Mattie McLean my bedstead that is down stairs my clock and glass lamp a gown and Shermis Brass Kettle, bible, window shades, Carving knife and fork I give and bequeath to Grand Ma Roach girls 2 dresses Black bunton and black Cashmere and all the eggs and Dolman clock and big winter shawl and 2 Cotton Comforts one is blue checked and the other is filled down with blue my shoes, hats and bonnet my black pattern dress and my checkers gingham and my silk mant.

I bequeath to Nettie Ross my bed and pillows and my picture.

I give and bequeath to Emma Roach my gold spectacles.

I give to Margaret McInturff 1 Shimmer trimmed in lavender trimming and a braided gown.

I give to Temple Garner Margaret McInturff, Nettie McLean

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and Brownlow Belt my dishes but I want sister Polly Lullack to have all my cupboard and kitchen furniture she needs her lifetime and then disposed of as herein mentioned.

I give and bequeath to Brownlow Belt a strawtick three pillows three comforts 2 wollen ones and a calico one, dog iron, and my 4 chain at sister Polly Lullack's death. 2 quilts one goose one one that is over and to his wife Lucy Belt I give all my old skirts and my water proof caps and all the old sheet.

I give and bequeath to Lemmie Garner a lambing skinnie and a underbunt she can give them out herself.

I give and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my personal property of every name and nature or kind to my aforesaid grand daughter Lula Ross including 2 silk skirts a black and white one and a black and white checked one and 2 cashmere dresses 2 trunks and all that is in them except my dolmans and big shawl and dolman cloak the big sporns and ten little sporns my baskets must be sold and the money goes to Lula Ross all that is or that I have given to Lula Ross is to her and her heirs.

I desire to be buried in a white gown and a lambing skinnie and a white flannel skirt white stockings and no gloves and I want Miss Shuffelbiller to make my coffin.

I hereby appoint George W. Ross sole Executor of this will.

I, J. C. Clark of Blount County, Tenn. being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time made.

I will and bequeath that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executor as soon after my death as practicable.

I will and bequeath to my wife, Elizabeth Clark, during her life or during her widowhood the period she may remain my widow, all my household and kitchen furniture and all the live stock that I may own at my death, to wit; horses, mules, cattle, sheep, hogs &c. and also my farming implements, including wagons, buggies, harness &c. In short, including everything on the home place pertaining to the farm. In the event that on the death of my wife there shall be any property designated in this paragraph remaining, the same is to be sold by my executor and distributed among her nearest of kin.

I give and bequeath my five shares of Bank Stock in the Sevier Bank, amounting to five thousand dollars to the following persons as follows: To my sister Cynthia Delozier a one seventh interest; to my brother W. B. Clark, a one seventh interest; to my brother Ben Clark a one seventh interest; to my sister Lemmie McMurry a one seventh interest; to the children of my deceased brother Ben Clark a one seventh interest; to the children of my deceased sister Nancy Johnson a one seventh interest, and to James Evans and Martha Evans, children of my deceased sister Hannah Evans, a one seventh interest. But my executor is required to retain my said five shares of bank stock in said bank during the natural life or widowhood of my said wife Elizabeth Clark and he shall pay to her the proceeds or dividends of said stock semi annually during her said natural life or widowhood.

I give and bequeath to my nephew Bro Delozier son of Leorum Delozier, one thousand dollars.
