I, Mrs. M. L. Catlett, of Blount County, Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory and aware of the uncertainty of life do make and publish this as my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void any and all wills and codicils thereto at any time made by me.

FIRST; I direct that all my just debts, if any, including my funeral expenses be paid.

SECOND; It is my desire and I hereby will and bequeath to Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in trust One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the principal to be kept in tact, and the interest to be used in protecting and caring for Pleasant Grove Cemetery and especially the graves of my beloved husband W. A. Catlett and myself.

THIRD; It is my desire and I hereby will and bequeath to Logan's Chapel Cemetery, a corporation, Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, the principal to be kept in tact and the interest to be used in caring for and protecting the graves of my parents who are buried therein.

FOURTH; It is my desire and I hereby will and bequeath to my daughter, Jonnie Willie Catlett, the house and ten acres of land located on the Sevierville Pike in the 9th Civil District of Blount County, Tennessee, being the property where we now reside.

FIFTH; It is my desire and I hereby will and bequeath to my daughter, May Catlett Cowden, the house and lot where she and

her husband now reside in Knoxville, Knox County, Tennessee, to be her separate property and estate; and also the sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred (\$5500.00) Dollars, to equalize her property devised in this paragraph with that devised to Jonnie in paragraph four.

SIXTH; It is my desire and I hereby direct my Executor hereinafter named to sell my farm located in the 12th Civil District of Blount County, Tennessee, to the best advantage he can, and as Executor make and execute a deed to the purchaser for the same, and out of the proceeds of the sale of said farm pay to my daughter May the amount set out in paragraph five of this will.

SEVENTH; It is my desire and I hereby will and bequeath to my daughters May and Jonnie the remainder of the proceeds of the sale of the farm above mentioned together with all other moneys, notes, mortgages and personal property of whatever kind or description wherever located or found, share and share alike.

EIGHT; I hereby nominate and appoint M. H. Gamble, Executor, of this my last will and testament.
