EDINGTON.

I, J. Marshall Edington being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and publish this as my last will and testament, making void all other wills, by me heretofore made,

First. I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid out of any money I may die seized or possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my executors.

Second. I give and bequeath to my wife Martha J. Edington the home where we now reside, in the 11th civil District of Blount County Tennessee, the same containing about six acres, with the improvements thereon, during her natural life, and I further direct that that she receive a rental of one fourth of the product of my farm in the 11th District of Blount County Tennessee, and of my farm in the 21st District of Knox County Tennessee, and I further direct that she receive the rents of my farm in the 14th Civil District of Knox County Tennessee, in South Knoxville, together with all royalty for stone used therefrom all the above to be for individual support during her natural life and I direct that the Executors of this will, look after the collection of all of said rents and royalties and pay and deliver same to her.

Third. I give and bequeath unto my sons William T. Edington and James P. Edington and James P. Edington, my farm in the 11th Civil District of Blount County Tennessee, known as the Robert Sharp farm, as now laid out to them,

Fourth. I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac Franklin Edington my farm in the 21st Civil district of Knox County Tennessee known as the Thos. Rule farm, including about three acres, running from a pine stump above a chestnut tree with the road to a hickory corner below the house, then with the Gideon line from the hickory to a rock corner below the house, then with Gideon line, as now laid out to him. I further bequeath to my son Isaac Franklin Edington my watch and one half the farming tools and horses I own at the time of my death, including wagons, hack, buggy, and carriage and the other half of said farming tools, horses and wagon hack buggy and carriage I give and bequeath to my grandson Harry Insley Edington, they to take possession of same at the time of my death.

Fifth. At the death of my wife Martha J. Edington, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy J. Edington and my grand son Harry Insley Edington, the home where we now reside including the six acres tract of land as heretofore bequeathed to my wife, together with all my household and kitchen furniture.

Sixth. At the death of my wife Martha J. Edington, I direct that the Executors of this will in the manner they may think best to settle the same and

for same sell my farm in the 14th Civil District of Knox County Tennessee, and pay to my daughter Nancy J. Edington and Theresa C. Clark, one hundred dollars each, and divide the remainder equally between my daughters viz: Nancy J. Edington, Lauretta Blasier, Algenia A. Jones, Theresa C. Clark, Ida J. Blasier, and Lillie O. Brown.

Lastly. I nominate and appoint my sons William T. Edington, and Isaac Franklin Edington, the executors of this my will. This May 23, 1903.
