Ezekiel Gribble.

I Ezekiel Gribble of Wellsville, County of Blount State of Tenn being of sound mind and memory do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, To Wit.

First All my just debts and funeral Expenses shall first be fully paid.

Second I give and bequeath to my Daughter Myrtle Gribble and her heirs one parcel or tract of land whereon I now reside and whereon my outbuilding are located and bounded as follows,

Beginning on a large gully about half way between my picket fence on public road leading from my residence to Wellsville Tenn and near the Christain Church and old gate at rear of church running thence a N. West course with meanders of gully before mentioned to a Spring branch, Thence with meanders of said branch to Corner to Calvin Millsaps farm. This being a conditional line between Myrtle and Eulah Henderson the remaining part of land bequeathed to my daughter Myrtle is bounded by lines of the Calvin Millsaps & Jno. F. Best on the West, W.T. Kirkland on the North and lands J.E. Ridge on East and containing 40 acres more or less. The above described tract of land is on Waters Nine Mile Creek in first Civil District of said Blount County and being a part of John Nelson tract.

Third. I give and bequeath to my daughter Eula Henderson the South side of my farm lying and being on the Waters of Nine Mile Creek in first Civil District of Blount Co. Tenn and bounded as follows Running with meanders of big Gully before mentioned and branch a West course and being the same conditional line between Myrtle Gribble and Eulah Henderson above mentioned with a Cross fence Thence running a South Course with said fence to line of D.C. Swaney, Thence a South East Course with said line to corner at picket fence in line of Wm. Bryant, thence with Picket fence & Wm. Bryant to public road Thence with public road and Ben Largent an East course to beginning corner in big Gully and containing Twenty-Five acres more or less.

Fourth I give and bequeath to my Son Dick Gribble one tract or parcel of land lying and being on Waters of 9 Mile Creek Blount Co Tenn and known as the Tilda Goforth or Calvin Millsaps farm and bounded as follows North by Myrtle Gribble South by same East by same, West by

Jno. F. Best also a tract on South side of Branch bounded by a conditional line to edge of cleared land in field near water gap between himself and James Gribble and Jno. F. Best on West containing 2 acres thence up ridge to Best line ~~more or less~~, being in the two tracts 18 acres more or less.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my Son James Gribble and his heirs one tract or parcel of land lying and being on the Waters of 9 mile Creek in the First Civil District of Blount County and bounded as follows : Beginning on corner of Jno. F. Best & Dick Gribble and running a South Course to D.C. Swaney Thence East course with line of said D.C. Swaney to corner to Eulah Henderson Thence with line of Eulah Henderson North Course with Cross fence to corner on branch Thence West course to corner with Dick Gribble, thence in line of Dick Gribble to line of Jno. F. Best also another tract known as J.R. Bryant tract- 3 acre tract Bounded on N. by W.T. Kirkland South by Wm. McCulloch E. by J.E. Ridge West by Myrtle Gribble. Both tracts containing 12 acres more or less.

I also bequeath to Jas. Gribble a narrow strip woods between Bryant 3 acre & Myrtle Gribble containing about 2 acres

Sixth I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha all of my personal property To-Wit One mule, 5 Head cattle, 5 Head Hogs, all my chickens, Bee stands and farm Tools, Wagon & Harness also 2/3 of proceeds of lands herein bequeathed during her natural life also she shall reside at the old homestead during life. If stock is not furnished then only one-third All parties h heretofore mentioned to have access to Spring, also my wife shall have right to use any timber needed for her benefit

Seventh, I bequeath to my daughter Ella Amburn \$5.00 jointly  
Eight I bequeath to the heirs of Josie Bryant (Dec.) \$1.00

Ninth. I bequeath to my daughter Lizzie Bagwell \$5.00

Tenth. I bequeath to my daughter Lula McCoy \$5.00

Eleventh I bequeath to my daughter Lola Ridge \$5.00

Twelfth I bequeath to my daughter Rosa Bryant \$5.00

Thirteenth, I bequeath to my three sons namely John, Jr., William and Marshall Gribble my estate willed to me by my brother Andrew Gribble, (Dead) of Georgetown Ky the same to be equally divided all expenses being paid for collection out of same.

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Martha Gribble and my Son Jno. J. Gribble as Executors to this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made (without bond)

I Herely will that my wife shall close up the bequeathed homestead

my son John J. shall be Executor as to business in Ky.

First; I desire that all my just debts and the expenses of my last sickness and funeral be paid as soon after my decease as possible.  
Second; For a long time I have been indebted to the late Andrew Gamble and to Will A. McTeer, originally the sum of ten dollars which amount was levied on a lot in the addition to Maryville in which I have lived for many years, which amount I desire to be paid and to that end that a lien be fixed on the lot, being the same on which I have been living for some time, and which lot I place a valuation of from two hundred to two hundred and fifty dollars.

Third; In my feeble condition Will A. McTeer has made advancements to me now amounting to ten dollars and fifty cents, and more may be be added, all of which I desire to be repaid.

Fourth; All that may be left above these amounts, I give and bequeath, including any and all personal property or effects, to Sookie Eugenia Davis, Cora Davis and their mother Lula Davis equally.

Fifth; I hereby constitute and appoint R. R. Kramer as Executor of this my last will and testament, and authorize him to make sale and convey any lands or lots to the purchasers, at public or private sale as to him

may appear to be for the best interest of the estate, and he relieved from making bond, taking oath and making settlement with the Clerk of the County Court.
