LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF M. A. HALL

I, M. A. Hall of the State of Tennessee, and the Town of Maryville, being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, revoking and making void all other wills and codicils, by me at any time made.

I

I give and bequeath to my Wife, Hassie Hall all the property, Real, Personal and Mixed, of which I ~~may~~ ^{have} die seized and possessed, after all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid.

II

At the death of my said Wife, Hassie Hall, I will that all the property of which I ~~may~~ ^{have} die seized and possessed and after the Life Estate of my said Wife will ^{have} cease, or, after the death of my said wife, the remainder of my said Estate shall be divided equally among my Five Children, share and share alike.

III

I hereby make and appoint My Son, Frank O. Hall Executor of this, my last Will and Testament, to serve without bond.

Jefferson Kidd

I, Jefferson Kidd, of Blount County, Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish this as my last will and Testament, revoking and making void any and all wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First: I will and direct that my Executor to be hereafter named pay any debts that I may owe, if any at the time of my death, including my funeral expenses, be paid out of any money or funds that may come into the hands of my Executors, as soon after my death as they can.

Second: I will and bequeath to my Grand daughter May Callahan and my Grand son Clyde Callahan, children and heirs at law of my daughter Ida E. Kidd, Three Hundred and fifty dollars each, this to be the full amount to each of them, I had formerly given to Ida E. their mother One Hundred dollars.

I have made advancements to my children as follows, viz: To Sam Kidd, \$1000. To R. N. Kidd \$1000-. To Lula E. Lowe \$1035. To George E. Kidd \$1000. To John R. Kidd \$800.00 To Will R. Kidd \$800. To Flora Broady, \$700. and to Clarence Broady son of my daughter May Kidd, Broady \$1000. It is my will that all of my children have equal shares of amounts in my estate except the two children of my daughter Ida E. Kidd, viz: May Callahan and Clyde Callahan, who are given \$350.00 each in the Second bequest of this my will.

In the event that Charles Broady should fail to pay to Clarence Broady, Three Hundred Dollars and reasonable interest on it, during the time he has had it, I will and direct that this last named amount and said reasonable interest be deducted from this amount for share going to my daughter Flora Broady, in the winding up of my estate, and the same paid to Clarence Broady.

It is my will that if I should die at a time while there is a growing crop on the farm, that my son George E. Kidd have all of the said growing crop. Third: I will and direct that my farm and all of my personal property be sold, and that the proceeds be equally divided between my heirs at law so as to make them share alike except the two children of Ida E. Callahan deceased to whom I have given the full amount intended for each of them in second item of this my Will. Lastly I hereby appoint George E. Kidd and John R. Kidd Executors to this my Will.

In witness whereof, I have signed and sealed and published and declared this instrument as my will, at my home near Maryville, Tenn. on this the 16th day of March, A. D. 1916.
