JAMES HARRIS.

I James Harris of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee do make and publish this my last will and testament.

1st. I give bequeath and will to my three sons Charles, William and James

Harris Jr. all my real estate consisting of the farm upon which I now reside lying and being on the waters of Nail's Creek and Little river in the 12 District of Blount County Tenn. Also one other tract of parcel of land recently purchased from W.A. Catlet adjoining my home farm and lying contiguous to it on the South in 12 dist. Blount County to have and to hold in their own name and for their own use and to their assigns forever upon the following conditions: That not more than two years after my death my son Charles Harris pay to my daughter Rebecca Cunningham Four Hundred Dollars \$400.00 and likewise William Harris pay the same amount to the same Rebecca Cunningham and also my son James Harris Jr. pay to the same party the same amount making twelve hundred dollars

I also give will and bequeath to my three sons named above all my personal property of which I may die seized and possessed including all live stock including horses mules cattle sheep hogs &c. also all farm machinery reapers mowers drills binders wagons hacks buggies and all kinds of harness and plow gearing also plows and harrows hay forks picks mattocks and shovels, also threshing machinery of all kinds I also give to my three sons above named (Charles William and James Harris Jr. one other small tract of land not named above lying inside of or surrounded by the lands above conveyed on which there is located a mill and machinery for running same also one engine attached all of which I give to my three sons above named it being my purpose to give to my daughter Rebecca Cunningham twelve hundred dollars and no more.

I Martha Hughes of Blount County State of Tennessee, Being of sound mind and disposing memory, and knowing the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life,

I do hereby make publick and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby by revoking and making all former wills by me at any time made.

1st. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executor as soon after my death as practicable.

2d. I give and devise to my husband C.S. Hughes my house and lot situated in the 9th civil district of Blount County Tennessee, and in the town of Maryville Tennessee, on which I now reside, for him the said C.S. Hughes to do as he pleases with it.

3rd. I give and bequeath to my husband C.S. Hughes all my household good and kitchen furniture to viz 2 beds and bedsteads and bed clothing one single bed and bed clothing, one Domestic sewing machine, one center table one Dining table, one wash stand one clock one burrow one cooking stove, all of my cash wire, one safe one wash tub and all my loose property if any I have not got in this my last will, now if there should be any trouble about this loose property I direct my Executor to turn all of said property and any other loose property that I may have left out of this will over to my husband C.S. Hughes, and lastly I nominate and appoint S.M. Morton of Maryville Blount County Tennessee Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name in the presence of these witnesses this 3rd day of June 1896
