WILL OF A. E. JONES.

I, Albert Jones of Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee, do make and publish this as my last will and testament.

I direct that in the event of my death, my property, both personal and real estate shall be divided among my heirs as follows:

WILL OF EDITH COLLUM.

I, Edith Collum, of lawful age, and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, publish and declare this, my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all other and former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

Item I.

I direct that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the first moneys belonging to my estate which shall come into the hands and possession of my executor, hereinafter named, and I direct that the sum of at least Two Hundred Dollars be appropriated and expended from my estate in giving me a proper burial, exclusive of, and in addition to, the expense of erecting the monument or tombstone over my grave, provided for in Item III below.

Item II

I direct that my Executors hereinafter named, have erected over my grave a suitable monument or tombstone for me, to cost not less than One Hundred Dollars.

Item III.

I give and bequeath unto my husband, James Collum, the sum of One Dollar.

Item IV.

I give, devise and bequeath unto Will Wilkens, whom I reared from childhood, my farm in Blount County, Tennessee, and all the stock and other personal property thereon, together with all the rest and residue of my estate, whether real, personal or mixed property, to do with or dispose of as he may see fit, the real estate to go to him in fee simple.

Item V.

I nominate and appoint East Tenn. Savings Bank of Knox County, Tennessee, Executor of this, my last will and testament, and require that he give bond and make settlement with the County Court, as required by law.
