5th I give and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Jones and two sons John B. and Charles B. Jones, equal share in any and all money in any manner derived from any mineral or mining interest on my

6th Whereas I have settled upon my daughter Lora E. Lloyd her portion and she is in no manner to share in any portion of my estate above set forth, yet should there remain any money after my debts are paid and not given and bequeathed as above set forth,

I give and bequeath to her Lora E. Lloyd and equal share of said money, so left over and not given and bequeathed with my wife Mary E. two sons John B. & Charles B. and daughter Effie B. Jones. Lastly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my son John B. Jones my executor.
