I give and bequeath to my two grand children, Mary Montgomery Porter and Robert Small Porter, children of my son Robert Porter, all of my money and property mentioned in item 2^d of this my last will and Testament to be equally divided between them, And I direct that my said Executor shall pay to them or their guardian, the interest annually on the money so loaned out by him until Robert Small Porter shall arrive at twenty one years of age when one half of said principal shall be paid to him, the other one half to be kept on interest by him (the interest of which to be paid annually) until Mary Montgomery Porter shall become twenty one years of age when the same shall be paid to her, It is provided however, that in case of the death of either of the said grand children before he or she shall have attained twenty one years of age then the share herein bequeathed to the one so deceased shall go to the survivor of said two grand children,

4th

I give and bequeath to my grand daughters, to be equally divided between them, all of

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my household goods and property,

Lee shall have the farm on which he lives and adjoining Hackney and also addition to the town of Friendsville containing by estimation one hundred and thirty seven acres, as a part of his legacy as set forth in article 3^d of this will, the same to be estimated in said division at thirteen hundred and fifty dollars (\$1350) in counting his part of the said estate.
5th

I constitute and appoint my son Theophilus B. Lee and my son-in-law J. W. Gothard my executors to carry out this will empowering them to sell all my personal property and real estate situate in the 2^d and 4th Districts of Blount County, Tennessee and make title to the same when sold.
