MILDRED MARSTON.

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN.

I, Mildred Marston, widow, of the County of Blount and state of Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, ordain and publish, this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First:- I desire that all just debts and liabilities for which I may be liable at the time of my death, together with the expenses of my last sickness and funeral be paid from the proceeds of any personal property of which I may be possessed, as soon after my decease as possible, or my children hereinafter named may pay the same, and take the personal property as their own, and whatever there may be over the amount necessary to pay the same to be equally divided between them.

Second:- I give and devise to my daughters, Fannie Marston, Lizzie Marston, Emily Marston and Martha Marston, jointly, the right, title, claim, interest and demand to the house and lot where I now live, situated in the 9th. district of Blount County, Tennessee, in the southern suburbs of the town of Maryville, fronting on Indiana Avenue, to be held by them jointly, and not sold or transferred by them or either of them unless they unanimously agree to such sale, and neither of them to sell or dispose of her interest or share unless the others shall each agree to such sale or disposal of such share or interest; but said devise is made on condition that my sons, who are single, to wit, W. Marston, Charles Marston and Frank Marston, shall have a home on the estate herein devised so long as they or either of them shall remain single and help to keep the premises up and in good order, but when either of them shall marry or fail in helping to keep up the premises up and in good order, then his right to make the same his home shall at once cease and exist only in those who remain single and continue to help in keeping the place up and in good order.

Third:- I hereby constitute and appoint Charles Marston as the Executor of this my last will and testament, and hereby relieve him from giving bond as such.

4th I give to my cousin Josie McCollum twenty dollars in cash Ten dollars to be paid by Andy Badgett and Ten dollars by King Coffin- I also give to Josie McCullum all my house-hold furniture

5th It is my will that my executor sell my two horse wagon and divide the proceeds equally between my brother Andy Badgett and my son Kink Coffin

6th I give and devise to my son King Coffin and my brother Andy Badgett each one half (1/2) of my real estate located in the 11th civil district of Blount County Ten and bounded as follows on the north by Rapae Badgett on the east by Mrs. Cass Russell, on the south by Elizabeth McBath and on the west by Sam Ballard to be divided equally by a line running north from Louisville and Knoxville public road to the top of the hill on the line of Sam Ballard, my brother Andy Badgett to have all on the north east side of said line and my son King Coffin all on the South west side of said line.

7th It is my will that Howard Badgett be the Executor of this my will.
