Second: I will and direct that the sum of One Hundred Dollars be paid to Morgan Llewellyn for money borrowed from him to cover expenses of Daisy's sickness when on the farm.

Third: I will and bequeath to Mrs. Mary J. Chumlea (called by me Mother) One Hundred dollars, this in remembrance for her kindness to my dear pet girl Daisy.

Fourth: I will and direct that the sum of One Hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be required to cover the expense of removing the remains of my wife Mary A. Fifth: I will and bequeath to my niece Miss Bertha McLane of Powell Station Tenn R F D # 2 Box 73 Twenty five dollars.

Sixth: I will and direct that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid to W. C. Chumlea for space on his lot for two graves for myself and my wife Mary A. McLane.

Seventh: I will my gold watch known as Daisy's watch to Charles E. Kirby, and my gold fountain pen, also I will to Charles E. Kirby and Pop Kirby my trot line complete, and to Charles E. Kirby my horn headed walking cane.

Eighth: I will to Mrs. Mary J. C. Chumlea my desk.

Ninth: If any moneys are left from my insurance or that I may have on hand after paying all the foregoing bequests as I will that it be divided equally between Mr. Charles E. Kirby and W. C. Chumlea, and it is my will that the check for my life insurance be deposited in the bank of Maryville and my Administrators draw their checks on the said fund.

Lastly: I hereby appoint Mary J. Chumlea as my Administratrix and Charles E. Kirby as her assistant, and she is excused from giving bond as such
