Third. I will and devise to my grand-nephew, William Peter Hood, a one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in my lot, situated on Church Street in Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee, being lot No. 8 in the plan of the town of Maryville, and on which there is a stable.

Fourth. I will, devise and bequeath to my grand-niece, Margaret E. Hood, a one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in my lot described in section third of this instrument (so that she and her brother William P. Hood shall own the whole of said lot), and ~~and~~ one feather bed, with 2 pillows, one bolster, 2 sheets, one comfort, a bed stand, my cherry bureau and a candle stand. The bed stand being my collaps bed stand, also my white quilt.

Fifth. I will and devise to Francis P. Hood, son of my nephew, Francis P. Hood, my vacant lot in the town of Maryville, Tenn., situate on the corner of College and Church streets, being lot No. 7 in the plan of the town of Maryville and adjoins the lot described in section 3 of this instrument.

I will and bequeath to Eliza M. Hood, daughter of my nephew Francis P. Hood a bureau and side saddle.

Sixth. I will and bequeath to Mary E. Hood, daughter of my nephew, Francis P. Hood one feather bed with two pillows, two sheets and one quilt.

Eighth. I will and bequeath to my niece, Harriett J. C. Henry, wife of John H. Henry six cane bottom chairs.

Ninth. I will and bequeath to John E. Hood my blue, red and white coverlet.

Tenth. I have a claim pending against the Government of the United States, which, if ever paid I will and bequeath to my two nephews, Francis P. and John E. Hood.

Eleventh. It is my will that whatever money I may have on hand after the payment of my debts and the bequests to my nephew

Twelfth. I will and bequeath to my niece, Minerva Reel, my entire wardrobe, except my double shell and my new black,

Thirteenth. I give and bequeath to my niece, Mary R. George, my shell,

Fourteenth. I give and bequeath to Mary P. McPeck, my black,

Fifteenth. I give and bequeath to Robert M. Hood, son of my nephew Francis P. Hood, all my pictures and one looking glass,

Sixteenth. I give and bequeath to Mamie M. Killip, one bed blanket.

Seventeenth. I will and bequeath to my nephew, Francis P. Hood, my rocking chairs, one bed blanket and all other articles not hereinbefore bequeathed.

Eighteenth. It is my will that all the bequest made in this my last will and testament shall be delivered to the party to whom said bequest is directed without the intervention of a guardian.

Nineteenth. I hereby appoint my friend and nephew A. M. Reel to be the executor of this my last will and testament.
