

FEBRUARY TERM 1921.

WILL OF LAURA GOFF MCCONNELL.

I, Laura Goff McConnell, being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all other wills and codicils by me at any time heretofore made.

FIRST: I direct that all my just debts, if any, including my funeral and burial expenses, together with the cost of a suitable monument to my grave, be paid out of my estate.

SECOND: It is my desire, and I hereby will, give, bequeath and devise unto my husband Ralph McConnell all of my property of every kind and description, both real, personal and mixed, except my rights and interests, both legal and equitable, included in and covered by the original and amended contracts entered into and made between Eliza Dickson and others with myself under dates of March 11, 1916 and August 2, 1916, respectively; which rights and interests under and covered by said contracts I hereby give and bequeath unto my children. But in the event I have no children living at the time of my death, I give and bequeath said rights and interests to my said husband Ralph McConnell.

THIRD: I hereby nominate and appoint my said husband Ralph McConnell sole Executor, of this my last will and testament, and I hereby excuse and release him from making bond and settlement with the courts.

WILL OF G. M. D. MISER.

I G. M. D. Miser, being Of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and publish this as my last will and testament.

First:

I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid out of first money that comes into the hands of my Executor.

Second:

I will give, devise and bequeath to my wife, Mary J. Third:

I will give devise and bequeath to my son H Clarence Miser, all of my personal property of every kind and description, consisting of horses cattle-hogs - ~~sheds~~ farming tools, notes, accounts and all personal property that I own at time of my death including money on hand.

Fourth:

I will and give to my three Grand children, Floyd Dyer, Ollie Dyer and Viva Dyer, the sum of three Hundred dollars each, to be paid to them out of the farm, if not paid otherwise by my Executor and to be paid as soon as my Executor can conveniently do so without embarrassing the estate, or unless I pay same before I die.

I hereby nominate my son H. Clarence Miser Executor of this my last will and testament.
