## WILL OF JAMES FRANKLIN MORTON.

I, JAMES FRANKLIN MORTON, do hereby make and publish this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made.

I am the owner of a farm in Blount County, Tennessee, with stock, farming tools and equipment thereon and other personal property. After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I desire that my wife, Lillie Harris Morton, should have all my property as I have the utmost confidence in her. I believe that she will use it for the benefit of herself and our children. I, therefore, will, devise and bequeath to my wife, Lillie Harris Morton, all my property, real, personal and mixed wherever situated, absolutely to use and dispose of as she may see fit so long as she remains my widow. Should she marry, however, I then direct that the property held by her at that time be divided, or if that can not be done, that it be sold for division and ~~be~~ divided equally among my children and my said wife, she receiving a child's part.

I request that my wife, Lillie Harris Morton, confer and advise with my brother, Ben A. Morton, in the management of the property.

I nominate my wife, Lillie Harris Morton, executrix of my will and excuse her from making bond or filing an inventory.

## LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JAMES H. JEFFRIES.

I, James H. Jeffries of Louisville, Blount County Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void any and all other wills or codicils thereto by me at any time heretofore made.

First, It is my will, and I hereby direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.

Second, It is my will, and I hereby give and bequeath unto my wife Callie Jeffries for and during her natural life, all of my household goods and effects of every kind and description; and also my engine, saw-mill, planing mill, mechanical lathe, machine shop, including all shafting, belting, tools, attachments, equipment, etc. of every kind and description incident to and connected therewith; and also my automobile and Ton Truck.

Third, It is my will, and I hereby give and bequeath unto my said wife Callie Jeffries all of my money and Bank certificates of every kind.

Fourth, It is my will, and I hereby give and devise unto my said wife Callie Jeffries, for and during her natural life all of my real estate of every kind and description, situated in the town of Louisville, Tennessee.

Fifth, It is my will, and I hereby bequeath and devise unto Eva Lena Wilkenson, Fredrick Milton Jeffries, Axie May Poland and Raymond Harvey Jeffries all of my personal property included in item "second" of this my will; and also all of my real estate, subject to the use, possession and control of my said wife Callie Jeffries for and during her natural life, as hereinbefore mentioned. Said property both real and personal shall go to my above named children in equal shares.

I have made no provision for my son Wilford Irwin Jeffries in this my last will, for the reason that I have already heretofore rendered him such financial assistance as makes him more than equal in what he has already received from me.

Sixth, It is my desire, and I hereby name and appoint W. F. Wilkinson sole executor of this my last will and testament.
