WILL OF ISAAC POTTER.

Nov. 23 1920.

Maryville Tennessee

I hereby will all of my land to my wife Elizabeth Potter to have and to hold during the remainder of her life time or she may sell the same at any time or any part thereof if she thinks necessary in order to satisfy my debts - this provision is made to take care of any debts I now owe or which may accrue. Provision is hereby made that this land or any necessary part of it shall be used to take care of my dependant son, John Potter - to provide for his needs in health or take care of him in case of sickness or death. My stock and tools are to be disposed of as follows: The mules and other farming tools and wagon are to be under the control of my son Geo. Potter if he choses to remain upon the farm for the purpose of operating the farm or to use in contract hauling or otherwise and in case the family should break up housekeeping and sell the land, the said stock and tools shall be disposed of by my wife Elizabeth Potter in such a way as to protect my son Geo Potter for his services in taking care of the family and the stock.
