WILL OF FANNIE J. MAYS.

Maryville Tenn. May 27 1919.

I Fannie J. Mays Do hereby make this my last will and testament It is my will to bequeath and devise unto my sons Ben Mays John Mays and Dan Mays the farm where I now live to be divided equally between them on conditions that they pay to my daughter Julia Mays One thousand dollars and to my daughter Jennie Magill Five hundred and to my two grand children Joe McCollum and Hester McCollum Five Hundred dollars each, and to Sons J. W. Mays W. F. Mays Ad D. Mays, Rex Mays Five dollar each I have have paid for an education for the four last named which shall be the remainder of their part. and to secure the payment of the above named sums of money given to each heirs there shall be a charge or lien upon the above named farm I will and bequeath all of the personal property that I may be possessed of at my death to my daughter Julia Mays.

WILL OF MRS. MARY E. PRESLEY.

I, Mary E. Presley of Maryville, Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void any and all former wills or codicils thereto by me at any time heretofore made.

1st. It is my will, and I direct that all my just debts, if any, including my funeral and burial expenses be first paid.

2nd. It is my will and I hereby will, give and devise unto my son Robert E. Presley my house and the double lot on which it stands, being Lots Nos. 162 and 163 in what is known as the Doll Mynders & Brown-les 1st Addition to the Town of Maryville, being the property known as my home place where I now live. It is also my desire, and I hereby will and direct that my son John M. Presley shall have a home with my son Robert L. Presley as long as Robert L. Presley owns said property; and in the event my son Robert sells said house and lots, he shall

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allow my son John a home with him- However this shall not in anyway interfere with my son Robert L. Beilung said property whenever he desires to do so.

3rd. It is my desire, and I hereby will, give and devise unto my son John M. Presley, one lot, being Lot No. 17 in what is known as the John Harris 1st Addition to Maryville, in the Western part of Maryville.

4th. It is my desire, and I hereby will, give and devise unto my son Robert L. Presley one lot, being Lot No. 18 in what is known as the John Harris 1st Addition to Maryville, in the Western part of Maryville.

5th. In case I have sufficient money or cash left at my death, I will, bequeath and give unto my sons, John M., Gus, Ed, Robert L. and Charlie Presley fifty (\$50.00) each.

6th. I hereby give and bequeath unto my son Robert L. Presley my household and kitchen furniture, together with any and all the remainder and residue of my estate.

7th. I hereby nominate and appoint my son Robert L. Presley sole executor of this my last will and testament, and I hereby excuse and release him from making bond, reporting to or settling with any of the Courts of this state.
