I, Riley P. Maranville, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and publish this as my last will and testament, making void all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

FIRST I direct that all of my debts and funeral expenses be paid out of any money that I may die seized and possessed of or may first come to the hands of my executor.

SECOND I give and bequeath to my grand daughter, Lena Maranville, the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, when she shall arrive at the age of eighteen (18) years, and that the person herein named to wit: James H. Mayfield, be appointed as her guardian for the purpose of carrying out the purposes of this will as to the said Lena Maranville, and he is directed to place said money in the bank at the best rate of interest obtainable and use out of same the sum of five dollars per month for her support, if necessary, payable every three months, unless on account of illness the said guardian is directed to use more of said funds per month if necessary, and when said Lena Maranville, shall arrive at the age of eighteen years said guardian is directed to pay to her whatever amount of said sum of three hundred dollars that may remain in his hands with accrued interest thereon.

If said Lena Maranville, should die before she arrives at the age of eighteen years, single and without issue then in that event I direct that all of the said bequest to her, remaining at the time of her death and after payment of funeral expenses, be divided equally among my children.

LASTLY I nominate and appoint H. O. Taylor, as executor of this my will. This 30 day of May 1912.

Know all men by these presents, That I Susannah Taylor-Daughter of Daniel Taylor Deed. recognizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, desiring to make a suitable testamentary disposition of the worldly goods with which I have been blessed, do hereby make, publish and declare this as my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made.

Item 1" I direct that my Executor shall pay all my just debts and funeral expenses, out of the first money belonging to my estate, that may come into his hands.

Item 2" After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I hereby give, devise and bequeath, all the rest and residue of my property of every kind-real, personal and mixed, to my two sisters, viz:- Lucy Callahan-wife of Amos Callahan and Malissa Chandler wife of Richard Chandler and their heirs in equal portions: that is to say, I devise and bequeath one-half of all my said property both real, personal and mixed to Lucy Callahan and her heirs, and the other one-half of said property I devise and bequeath to Malissa Chandler and her heirs.

Item 3" I hereby nominate and appoint Amos Callahan Executor of this my last will and testament.
