6<sup>th</sup> I will to my daughter Hulda Hatchet the land where I now  
live containing one hundred acres more or less and another tract  
containing 30 acres more or less adjoining the lands of Stephen Husley  
and myself I consider this her part with the advantages she has  
had heretofore

7. I will that after my death and my wife die or cease to be a  
widow my before heirs mentioned divide the things between themselves that  
is not mentioned in this will and if they cannot agree to divide it  
that it be sold and divide equally between them.

8. I will that if any of my heirs contest or try to seize this shall  
not have anything. This the 17 day of November 1894. Whereunto
