H U F F S T E T L E R .

I George W. Huffstetler, of Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made.

F i r s t .

It is my will that all my just debts be paid, including funeral expense and cost of a suitable monument for myself, as soon after my death as may be convenient.

S e c o n d .

I give and devise all my property both real and personal and mixed to my beloved wife, M. E. Huffstetler, for and during her natural life or as long as

she shall remain my widow.

T H I R D .

At the death of my said wife or in the event she should remarry, it is my will that the following disposition be made of all my property, to-wit:

Upon the death or remarriage of my said wife it is my will if there remain any of my daughters unmarried she or they shall have control of and have the exclusive right to occupy and enjoy my house and lot where we now live in South Maryville, in what is known as the Stanley addition, as long as she or they, as the case may be, shall remain single for a home, and after they are all married my said house and lot shall go to my children, or those representing them, to be divided between them equally.

F o u r t h .

I give and devise the town lots which I bought of Mrs. Howe, on the West side of Indiana Avenue, to my three daughters, Anna, Zona and Effie. This devise is also to take effect upon the death or marriage of my said wife as stipulated in item ~~third~~ above.

F i f t h .

I give and bequeath to my grand-son, Freddie Huffstetler, one hundred dollars.

S i x t h .

I will and devise all my real estate, not already herein disposed of, and all my personal property which may be left at the death of my wife or at her remarriage, to my children, or those representing them, to be divided between them equally.

S e v e n t h .

I appoint my daughter, Anna Huffstetler, the executrix of this my last will and relieve her from making bond as required by law.
