1. I, D.B. Lawson of Cades Cove Blount County Tennessee, do hereby, by this my last Will and Testament, dispose of all my property—both real and personal and mixed, hereby revoking any and all other wills heretofore made by me—

Item 1st.

I direct my Executors to pay all my just debts and my funeral expenses out of the first money belonging to my estate, which may come into their hands.

Item 2
