(In the manner and form following that is to say)

First I commend my Immortal being to him who gave it and my body to the mother earth to be buried with little expence; by my Executor hereinafter named and as to my worldly estate (Item 1st) I give and bequeath to my son James A. Davis one half of my land being and lying on the South side of the Sevierville Pike known as my Brickyard place it being the west half of same and also one House and Lot being on the west corner of Nelson and Bell street Knoxville Tenn to have and to hold the same and all the profit income and advantage that may result therefrom from and after the Deceased of my wife Margaret A Davis and all her funeral charges have been paid to have and to hold the same to the said James A. Davis during his natural life then to his Heirs forever.

(Item 2nd) I gave and bequeath to my soninlaw C.L. Holt and S.T. Holt his wife the old home place near the Depot at Maryville Tenn where my wife now lives and also the other side of the Brick yard place on the Sevierville Pike it being the East side (or 1/2) to have and to hold to them and their heirs from and after the deceased of my wife with all the profits income and advantage that may result therefrom forever.

All the rest of my estate Personal or mixed or which I shall die seized and possessed or to which I shall be entitled to at the time of my decease I gave devise and bequeath to be equally divided to and between my son James A. Davis and S.T. Holt that is after all funeral expences has been paid in full My said wife Margaret A Davis is to have full control of all all my real estate personal or mixed that I die in possessed or which I may be entitled to at the time of my decease during her natural life then to be divided as aforesaid Lastly I do nominate and apoint Philip A. Davis to be the executive of this my last will and testament

I, William S. McTeer, being in frail health, but of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, that it to say,

First:- After the payment of my last sickness and funeral, I desire that one fourth of what I may die seized and possessed, be set apart and I hereby give and bequeath the same to the child or children of my son Will C. McTeer, but from this amount I desire to be paid six dollars which was borrowed from Will A. McTeer to send my said son to school and has not been repaid and about twelve dollars which he owes to J.H. Greer, unless he shall repay said sum. I give to this to his wife and children Ruby Rosa Lee McTeer now born, and any other to be born to him, and if necessary to protect the same to said children that some good and sage guardian be appointed to take and use the same to the best advantage of the children, regardless of my said son, who I desire shall not be allowed to handle the same in raising the child or children.

Second:- I give and bequeath one fourth of what I may be seized and possessed to my son Jesse Henry McTeer.

Third:- I give and bequeath all the rest and remainder of what I may be seized and possessed to my beloved wife and my two daughters, to use and control by my wife while she lives, and then divided equally between my two daughters.

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W I L S O N .

I, Mary Allen Wilson, widow, of Maryville, in Blount County, Tennessee, being now in feeble health, but of sound mind and memory, and realizing the uncertainty of the length of life and the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last will and testament, that is to say:-

First:- I desire that all the expenses of my sickness and burial be paid as soon after my decease as possible; that my body be laid by the side of my husband and son in Maryville Tennessee; that the date of my death be placed on the

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monument which has been erected on the lot, and that markers be placed at my grave similar to those which have been placed at the graves of my husband and son. I also give to Magnolia Cemetery the sum of Fifty dollars to be kept separate and at interest, the interest of which shall be used in keeping the lot in repair and good condition.

Second:- It is my will that such parties as may be owing my estate, shall not be unduly pushed or pressed for the payment of their notes, but that they shall be given a reasonable time in which to make payments.

Third:- I give and bequeath to my niece Calista Allen, of New Brunswick, New Jersey, one hundred dollars, also all of my personal property, excepting the hotel fixtures and furnishings at Mt. Nebo.

Fourth:- I give and bequeath to Blount County, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, to be placed in the Treasury of said County, said sum to be kept at interest, well secured, the same to be known as the "A.A. Wilson School Fund", the interest of which shall be used as my executor and the County Superintendent of Public Instruction may regard as will be for the best welfare of the public schools of the County. In this I would suggest that School Districts be encouraged to supplement the public schools by subscriptions and a bounty given to such districts; also to aid in supplying deficiencies in the way of books, writing material, slates, etc., from this fund. In case my executor, for any reason ceases to act, either by reason of resignation, death, or settlement of the estate, I desire that the session of New Providence Presbyterian Church, of Maryville may designate a Trustee to act in the distribution of this fund.

Fifth:- I give and bequeath five hundred dollars to the Board of Directors of Maryville College to be placed as part of the Alumni Fund of said institution, and invested and used as the College invests and uses said Alumni Fund, under the same rules and regulations.

Sixth:- I give and bequeath to New Providence Presbyterian Church, of Maryville, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be kept at interest, well secured, and the interest only to be used in keeping the parsonage of said church in repair and good condition.

Seventh:- I give and bequeath to New Providence Presbyterian Church, of Maryville, the further sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, to be kept at interest well secured, from which twenty five dollars of the principal together with the accrued interest, each year, shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society of said Church, to be di-

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vided equally between the Boards of Home and Foreign Missions, until all is expended in this manner.

Eighth:- I give and bequeath one hundred dollars each to the following Boards of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, to-wit:- "The Board of Education of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America," "The Presbyterian Board of Relief for disabled Ministers and the Widows and Orphans of Deceased Ministers", "The Board of Publication of Sabbath School Work of the Presbyterian Church", and also the sum of one hundred dollars to the American Bible Society.

Ninth:- I give and bequeath one hundred dollars to the Blount County Industrial Home, located at Maryville.

Tenth:- I give and bequeath to New Providence Presbyterian Church, of Maryville, the sum of fifty dollars to be used in the cause of local missions of "Neighborhood Work" in the town of Maryville.

Eleventh:- I give all the remainder of my estate, of whatever nature or kind, to "The Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America", and to "The Board of Home Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, incorporated April 19, 1872, by the Act of the Legislature of the State of New York", to be equally divided between these two boards.

Twelfth:- I hereby constitute and appoint Will A. McTeer, of Maryville, Tennessee, to be the Executor of this my last will and testament, and if for any reason he can not serve, I designate who ever may be the Treasurer of New Providence Presbyterian Church to act as such executor.
