I, W.C. Wrinkle, of Blount County, Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, knowing the uncertainty of this life and the certainty of death, do make, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void any and all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

THE RESERVE OF THE PARTY OF THE

First,- I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executorin hereinafter named, as soon after my death as practicable.

Second, - I will that after the payments of my just debts, etc. as above mentioned, that all the remainder of my personal and real property be used for the benefit and support of my wife, Mary Ann Wrinkle dueing her life time, she to have full control of said property, and after her death the remainder of my property to be disposed of as hersinafter provided.

Third,- I will and bequeath to my brother Hugh Wrinkle, Four Thousend, (\$4,000.00) Dollars; to the three children of my niege, Minnie Lee Walker, deceased, jointly, One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars; to my niece Elia W. Bailey and her husband, William Bailey, Five Hundred (\$506.00) Dollars; to my nephew and name-sake, Chas. Cowan Clark, Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars; to Robert Clark, Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars; to the Cumberland Presbyterian Theological Seminary, (\$500.00) Five Hundred Dollars. Should there not be sufficient funds to pay all the above bequests in full then they shall be paid pe pro rate in accordance with the amounts of the different bequests. Fourth, - The balance of my estate, after the payment in full of the Me specific bequests mentioned in paragraph "Third" shall be divided into three equal parts, one third of which shall go to the Cumberland Presbyterian Theological Seminary; one third to be equally divided between my nephew Perry Wrinkle and my niece Ella W. Bailey; one third to the five children of my deed, brother Zebulon Wrinkle; the children of such of se his children as are dead, taking their parents share.

Fifth, - Should any of the beneficiaries under this Will not be satisfied with their proportion or part under this Will or for any reason shall cause any trouble or institute proceedings regarding my estate after my death, then such beneficiary or beneficiaries shall lose the amount or amounts left to them by this Will.

Sixth,- I do hereby nominate my brother-in-law Thomas Clark as Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and such is my faith and confidence in him. that I hereby release him from making any bond, taking oath as is ordinarily required by law, but ask that he make a report of such amounts as may come into his hands and that he make a final settlement with the County Court showing the distribution of my estate.

Seventh .- The Executor is directed to dispose of any and all of my property, both real, personal or mixed at private or public sale, which ever in his judgment shall be to the best interest of the estate.
