and fully confirm this my last will and testament
it is my will that my James Carson & Smith
have one hundred acres of land off of the east end
of the farm on which I live on Watunga River one
mile below Elizabethton The lower line to Commence
on the river near his house, so as to enclose his Deed
Ging House on his own land, I also agree to pro-
vide a government) Give to him thirty best acres of my
farm after it is divided (or one of the log farms with
the attached sheds) The balance of the aforesaid farm it
is my will shall be equally divided between my Daughters
Trent Anna Smith Eliza ^{and} formerly Abby
Smith Sarah Smith Elizabeth Smith & Louisa Smith
The first part next the river, on which the dwelling
house stands shall be given to Elizabeth giving
to her an equal proportion of ^{and} land and she is to
pay the sum of fifty dollars to the other heirs, Smith
the giving the house to Elizabeth is provided she
should survive me & my wife Mary Smith, who
is to hold it so long as she lives after my death at
the death of my wife all my personal property
money if any left &c shall be divided equally be-
tween all my children - James Carson and John
Smith excepted In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand acknowledging the foregoing to be correct
and true will and testament - not allowing any
advantage to be taken of any informality in the same
