This was the last will and Testament of Leonard
Hart Webb exhibited and proved in Open Court
by the subscribing Witnesses thereto.

I Leonard Heart of Sound and perfect mind
and memory, do make and publish this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved
Wife Phoebe Heart the following described property
to wit All my Cupboards and one Bureau
One Kitchen Cupboard, two brass cooking pots
One Large Iron Stove, one deep Skillet, one pot Trivet
One fire Shovel, one brass dressing Table, one Feather
Bed, Blanket & Clothing thereto belonging to and her

a daughter Phoebe Heart, son Solomon, and daughter Phoebe
and of my life to be born, and the proceeds, during
among my several children together with the following
property my wife is to have at my death and
the proceeds, division as above stated to wit one Feather
Bed Stead belonging for the same to include one double
bed coverlet, one clock, one corner cupboard, all my
shop tools such as are used for tanning, one crop cut
and Harrow Saw, two tenant Saws, two Joining planes,
together with two beading planes, two sets and Saws,
one Awl and Vice, one Big Hammer & one hand hammer
One pair of tongs, all to be sold at my death and the
proceeds to be divided among my several children
My Wife Phoebe Heart is not to be disturbed but to have
peaceable possession of the Dwelling House and all the
furniture both in House and Kitchen during her life
time, but at her death or removal from said residence
then the furniture not herein bequeathed to her is to
be sold and proceeds applied as herein before stated
I do give and bequeath to my son Solomon Heart &
Abraham Heart the tract of Land on which they and I
now live, lying in Carter County State of Tennessee in
District No 8 Joining the lands of Wm Bishop, Peter W
Emmett and others containing by estimation two
hundred acres more or less to be equally divided between
them but I reserve of them to wit Solomon Heart and
Abraham Heart, the maintenance of me and my wife
Phoebe during our lives, to consist of two hundred pounds
of pork, thirty Bushels of Wheat & one hundred and ten
Bushels of Corn annually, but at the death of one of us
then they are required to pay one half of the above sum
during the life time of the other, and further at my
death they are required to bury me in a decent man-
ner and further my will is that my son Solomon
Heart & Abraham Heart jointly and severally pay
to my daughter Susannah Heart wife of Solomon

Mendon, to my daughter Catherine Manning wife of
 William Manning, to my daughter Polly Nichols wife
 of John Nichols, each the sum of One hundred and
 twenty five dollars, in good trade within three years
 after my death also to William Dexter my grand
 son the sum of One hundred dollars, to my daughter
 Lucy Leavitt wife of Jonathan Leavitt the sum of
 Twenty five dollars, to my daughter Sarah
 Mithum wife of John Mithum the sum of
 Twenty dollars, all of which payments to be
 made within three years after my death in good
 trade, also to my daughter Elizabeth Crow wife
 of Isaac S. Crow the sum of fifteen dollars in
 cash to be paid as soon as they can be in a
 reasonable time & lastly to this my son I constitute
 and appoint Henry Little my sole executor of
 this my last will and testament, hereby repealing
 all former wills by me made. In witness
