in open Court William Childress and after  
being duly sworn deposed and said that he was  
intimately acquainted with Thomas Childress in  
the year 1777 at the time he Entered the army of  
the United States and that he was absent from  
his friends three years and then returned  
and that the present applicant is the identical  
person who enlisted in the State of Virginia in  
the year 1777 as aforesaid and that he was  
during all the time of his absence from home  
reported & believed to  
be in the army and that said Thomas  
Childress in the neighborhood in which  
he resides is reported to have been a sol-  
dier of the Revolution as stated in his de-  
claration in which opinion this deponent  
concurs.
